

Tuesday Nov 23th

1869.

Fair, wind light East night from S.E. but at day
became calm all day until 5 P.M. when a breeze
sprang up from S.E. Storing fuel and by
on Port Rock. Engaged this afternoon at making
up a condenser out of the coils copper and
thicket but have not made any water yet.

Lat 3.40 S Long 40.56 E.

Wednesday Nov 24th

Fair, wind light from S.E. Course S. by W. Have
not done much of anything. Brought out water
this morning put all hands for each aft man
allowance of three quarters per day No tea or
coffee yet at all.

Lat 4.24 S Long 40.27 E.

Thursday Nov 25th

Squally, with rain all this P.M. no wind at all.
There was baffling. Course from S. to S.W. Passed
Punta Sol at 10 A.M. In sight this evening
from masthead beam bearing W at 4 P.M.
but the cable to the starboard bearing anchor
in case of drifting ashore. A strong current
setting toward it.

Lat 4.50 S Long 40.16 E.

Friday, Nov 26th

Fair, wind moderate from S.E. Storing I met all
day. Punta on our lee beam in sight this eve
12 miles distant. Storing W. by W this evening.

Saturday Nov 27th

1869.

Fair, wind light from E this morning this evening
back a good breeze from E. Sailed back most
all night. David Gonzales the morn at daylight
came to anchor at the north watering place
at 7 o'clock 8 1/2 fathoms of water and gave her 40
fathoms of chain.

Sunday Nov 28th

Fair, wind light from S.E. At 8 A.M. Landed the
barboard boat, Capt and mate went ashore and
the boat crew up to the town staid all day
came aboard at 7 P.M. Including myself I found
it an bigger hole.

Monday Nov 29th

Fair, wind light from S.E. Got a breakfast at 6
A.M. and carried a raft of 38 casks. Got off a
raft of 20 casks and hoisted it board, and boat
crew went to the town and staid all day.

Tuesday Nov 30th

Fair, wind light from S.E. Got off a raft of 20
casks of water this forenoon. Got underway at noon
and came to anchor at the town of
Gonzalez at 20 o'clock A.M. Ship Cosack I heard
shot with several other men at war. The English
man of war Dryad left this morning for Port
Luzon.

Wednesday Dec 1st

Fair, wind light from S.E. Engaged at
setting up the beach rigging and painting
ship starboard side. Took in 200
lbs butter carried it ashore sold it at 4 o'clock
per pound.
