Monday

First part of this day began with light breeze and pleasant weather. Sch. cruising under all sails out crew. Employed in washing also saw school of Grampers and porpoises. Latter same weather.

This 24 hours pleasant weather with light wind from N.E. Sch. cruising under all sails set steering by the wind crew. Employed in doing various little jobs on rigging every thing quite also break out 50 pounds of sugar. Latter same.

This day began with light breeze and fine weather. Sch. cruising under all sails out and steering S.E. also saw Grampers 2 sails in sight. Latter same kind of weather.

1907 August 1907

Thursday

First of this day fresh breeze and pleasant weather. Sch. cruising under all sails out and heading S.E. & S. also saw Grampers and spoke with full rigged ship bound Madagascar. Latter same weather 4 sails in sight.

Friday

This day began with dead calm and fine weather. Sch. laying under 2 peace sails also 3 sails in sight. Crew employed in doing odd jobs on deck and saw porpoises. Latter same kind weather and same sails in sight.

Saturday

This 24 hours dead calm and pleasant weather. Ship heading N.N.E. on port tack. Also saw 2 sails in sight and saw log with lots fish but caught only one big dolphin and three little. Patascar later at 4:30 raised one large sperm whale for which we lowered 3 boats and first mate had chance but boatster was so trembling that he could not strike the whale while whale is going they still chase them and S.B. got fast and got him alongside at 6:15 P.M. Latter cut kind fresh started in cut the whale.
