Fine weather cruising on opposite tack saw grampuss crew employed in doing various ship works saw one sail saw killers and grampuss steering N.E.

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Sunday 14

First part of this 24 hours comes with strong breeze wind sehr heading N.E. under all sails set raised a large sperm whale and lowered three boats. Waest boat darted but did not get fast in sometime boat capsized and got stuck without fast also S.B. boat got near to the whale close enough to strike but did not darted the iron Lat 33.30 Long 45.00

Monday 15

This 24 hours strong breeze and heavy seas sehr heading N.E. under all sails in morning saw a few spouts keep looking for a good while but haven't see him anymore latter much as first Lat 29.50 Long 43.40

Tuesday 16

Strong breeze wind sehr heading by the winds under lower sails crew doing various ship works at midnight struck up heavy squalls and rain took in sail latter blowing quite strong. Broke out 50 pound sugar and 16 lbs flour.

Wednesday 17

This 24 hours began with strong breeze wind sehr flying to under topsails while wind moderates some employed in ship works latter same Lat 27.50 Long 40.45
