

Wednesday Febr. 1st Commences with a light breeze and fine pleasant weather steering S. W. & S. 2 sails in sight - Middle part the same - Latter part heading S. Lat. 50° 15' S. Long. 64° 30' W.

Thursday Febr. 2nd Light breeze from S. W. and fine weather. At 4 p.m. saw the ship Brutus of Warren, Cpt. Swift, 2 months out 70 lbs. steam, steering S. by W. - Middle part strong wind, steering S. by W. - Latter part steering S. - Lat. 51° 46' S. Long. 64° 41' W.

Friday Febr. 3rd Strong wind and pleasant weather steering S. by E. with all sail out Middle part the same - Latter part thick rainy weather, at 11 a.m. saw the coast of Tierra del Fuego no Obs.

Saturday Febr. 4th Commences with a strong N. W. wind and thick rainy weather steering in for the land at 3 p.m. took in the light sail, double reefed the fore top sail and luffed to the wind heading N. N. E. - Middle part calm - Latter part a light breeze from N. W. steering S. saw Staten Island. Lat. 54° 22' S. Long. 63° 08' W.

Sunday Febr. 5th Commences with a light breeze from the W. heading S. S. W. one sail in sight Staten Island bearing W. dist. 15 miles at Sunset the wind hauled to S. heading E. S. E. Middle part light wind and calm - Latter a light air from N. E. steering S. W. by S. no Obs.

Monday Febr. 6th Commences with a light breeze from N. E. with thick rainy weather, steering S. W. by S. Middle part calm - Latter part a light variable breeze heading from S. to S. W. by S. and very foggy no Obs.

Tuesday Febr. 7th Commences with a strong breeze from S. E. and thick foggy weather steering S. W. by S. Middle part strong wind from the N. took in the light sail and double reefed the top sails Latter part it blew a Gale the wind hauled to W. heading S. W. by S. took in all sail but the close reefed main top sail Lat. 51° 06' S. Long. 66° 30' W.

Wednesday Febr. 8th Commences with a moderate Gale from the W. heading S. W. by S. set the fore sail and close reefed fore top sail - Middle part let a reef out the top sails and set the main sail, heading from S. W. to W. by S. at Sun rise had on all sail - Latter part it blowed on again double reefed the top sails, heading S. W. by S. and very rugged. Lat. 58° 02' S. Long. 67° 35' W.

Thursday Febr. 9th Commences with a very strong wind from the W. and very rugged, heading S. W. by S. at 5 p.m. took in all sail but the close reefed main top sail and fore sail, wore Ship heading N. - Middle part took in the fore sail Latter part the same no Obs.
