

Friday Febr. 10th Commences with a strong Gale from the W. heading N. N. W. and very rugged with thick rainy weather - Middle part more moderate. Latter part made all sail she could bear heading N. W. Lat. 57° 35' S. - Long. 66° 08' W.

Saturday Febr. 11th Commences with a strong wind and very rugged heading N. W. spoke the Bark Favorite of Fair haven Cpt Spooner 3 months out no Obs. at Sunset it blew a strong Gale took in all sail but the close reefed main top sail Middle part the same - Latter part more moderate and made all prudent sail, at 10 a.m. spoke the Bark Nottingham of London Eng. 30 days from Australia bound to London no Obs.

Sunday Febr. 12th Commences with a Gale from the W. heading S. and very squally - M. at 7 p.m. wore Ship heading N. W. middle part the same - Latter part it moderated and made sail heading W. S. W. 2 sail in sight and thick rainy weather no Obs.

Monday Febr. 13th Commences with a light N. W. breeze and rainy steering W. S. W. with all sail out one sail in sight - Middle part strong wind close reefed the top sails - Latter part the wind hauled to the S. W. heading S. S. W. a number of sails in sight set the mainsail jib and spanker. Lat. 56° 50' S. Long. 67° 30' W.

Tuesday Febr. 14th Commences with a Gale from the S. W. and very squally with rain heading S. S. W. under close reefed top sails and fore sail, a number of sails in sight - Middle and Latter part the same Lat. 57° 42' S. - Long. 66° 21' W.

Wednesday Febr. 15th Commences with a strong Gale from the W. and very squally with rain heading S. S. W. one sail in sight, at Sun set it moderated, set the close reefed fore top sail and fore sail - Middle part calm Latter part a light breeze from the E. and spread all sail steering W. by S. one sail in sight, at half past 11 a.m. the blind hauled to the S. E. and freshened to a strong breeze no Obs.

Thursday Febr. 16th Commences with a strong wind from S. E. with rain and snow at 2 p.m. the wind increased to a Gale took in all sail but the close reefed main top sail steering W. by S. one sail in sight - Middle part the same Latter part more moderate with a light variable breeze heading from W. by S. to W. S. W., spread all sail. Ends with fair pleasant weather Lat. 57° 27' S. - Long. 69° 44' W.

Friday Febr. 17th Light breeze from W. S. W. heading N. W. with all sail out and fine pleasant weather, at 1 p.m. tacked Ship heading S. W. at half past 3 p.m. the wind hauled to the S. with thick rainy weather, at 7 p.m. took in the light sails and double reefed the top sails - Middle part heading S. S. W. Latter part heading N. W. and fine pleasant weather Lat. 57° 18' S. - Long. 71° 44' W.
