

Tuesday Feb. 28th Commences with a strong wind from the W. heading N. N. W. with double reefed top sails and courses set, and clear weather - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail heading N. and N. by W.
Lat. 48° 52' S. - Long. 78° 54' W.

Wednesday March 1st Commences with a strong breeze from W. heading N. and N. by W. took in the main top gallant sail and fly jib. Middle part the same - Latter part the wind from the S. W. steering N. W. by N. with all sail out. Lat. 46° 57' S. - Long. 78° 27' W.

Thursday March 2nd Commences with a light S. W. breeze steering N. W. by N. employed mending the waist boat - Middle and Latter part the same employed in various ways Lat. 44° 50' S. - Long. 78° 32' W.

Friday March 3rd Light wind and pleasant weather steering N. N. W. employed in various ways Middle part the same - Latter part employed sending down the old main top gallant mast Lat. 42° 21' S. - Long. 78° 30' W.

Saturday March 4th Commences with a fresh breeze from the S steering N. by W. employed sending up another main top gallant mast and yard with fine pleasant weather, saw a fin back Middle part steering N. E. W. Latter part steering N. by E. - Lat. 39° 31' S. - Long. 77° 39' W.

Sunday March 5th Commences with a strong S. wind steering N. E. under double reefed top sails and fore sail, at sunset took in sail for the night and set boats crew watches steering N. E. W. - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail and steered E. N. E. Lat. 37° 29' S. - Long. 76° 55' W.

Monday March 6th Commences with a strong wind from the S. and squally with a rugged sea, steering E. by N. under short sail, at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind to S. E. Middle part the same - Latter part made sail, spoke the Robert Edwards of New Bedford Capt Kelly 6 months out 120 tbs. sp. steering N. N. W. Lat. 37° 09' S. - Long. 75° 35' W.

Tuesday March 7th Commences with a strong southerly wind steering N. N. W. under easy sail, at sunset took in the fore top sail and luffed to the wind heading W. S. W. Middle part the same - Latter part made sail and steered E. N. E. saw Black fish and lowered one boat but without success. Lat. 35° 54' S. - Long. 76° 18' W.

Wednesday March 8th Commences with a strong breeze from the S steering W. employed mending the starboard keel, at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind heading to the S. W. Middle part the same - Latter part made sail and steered W. N. W. saw some fin backs. Lat. 34° 59' S. - Long. 78° 05' W.
