

Thursday March 9th Commences with a strong S. E. breeze, steering N. W., employed in various ways saw a number of fin backs, at Sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind, heading S. S. W. - Middle part the same - Latter part saw the Island Juan Fernandez distant 35 miles bearing N. W. by W. made sail and stored for it, one sail in sight. Lat 33° 56'.

Friday March 10th Commences with a moderate breeze and pleasant weather steering in for the Island at 4 p.m. spoke the Ship Enphratia of New Bedford 32 months out 200 bls sp. and 200 bls wh., at Sunset took in sail heading E. Middle part at 1 o'clock were Ship heading S. W. by S. - Latter part stored in for Juan Fernandez, at half past 8 a.m. lowered 2 boats, one to go a fishing and the other to take the Capt. on shore, a number of sails in sight.

Saturday March 11th Strong breeze and squally, the Ship standing off and on waiting for the boats, at 1 p.m. the boats returned and stored W., at 3 p.m. spoke the Bark A. R. Tucker of Dartmouth. Capt. Smith, clean at Sunset took in sail steering W. S. W. - Middle part heading S. W. by S. - Latter part at daylight saw Massafuero distant 40 miles bearing W. S. W. made sail and stored for it, one sail in sight. Lat. 33° 41' - Long. 81° 16' W.

Sunday March 12th Commences with a strong breeze steering S. W., at 1 p.m. passed Massafuero distant 4 miles, saw some fin backs, at Sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind heading S. W. by S. - Middle part the same - Latter part spread all sail - Massafuero in sight bearing E. distant 45 miles. Lat. 33° 55' S. - Long. 81° 36' W.

Monday March 13th Light wind and pleasant weather heading E. N. E., one sail in sight, and Sunset took in sail and were Ship heading S. W. by S. Middle part the same - Latter part made sail one sail in sight.

Tuesday March 14th Light wind and pleasant weather at 5 p.m. spoke the Ship Gazelle of Nantucket 15 months out. 400 bls sp. - Middle part the same - Latter part heading E. by S. - Massafuero bearing E. N. E. distant 40 miles. Lat 33° 55' S.

Wednesday March 15th Light wind and pleasant weather, heading E. by S. at Sunset Massafuero bearing N. N. E. distant 15 miles Middle part steering S. E. - Latter part stored for the Island spoke the Ship Gazelle. 2 sails in sight.

Thursday March 16th Strong wind and rugged, at 1 p.m. 2 boats went a shore fishing, at 5 p.m. they returned with some fish. 4 sails in sight Middle part and Latter part calm with rain 3 sails in sight.
