

Thursday June 15th Strong breeze and hazy, at 6 p. m. spoke the Ship's Constitution and Catalpa of Vantacket - Middle part heading W. by S. Latter part 2 sails in sight, at 10 a. m. tacked Ship heading N. N. E.

Friday June 16th Strong breeze and hazy, heading N. N. E., at Sunset took in sail and wore Ship heading to the S. W. - Middle part the same. Latter part made sail and steered E. S. E. spoke the Bark Catalpa of New Bedford 22 months out 400 bl's of. Lat. 23° 27' N. Long. 111° 43' W.

Saturday June 17th Strong breeze and rugged steering E., saw some Brucias, steered for them, but saw no more of them, at 6 p. m. took in sail and luffed to the wind heading N. N. E. Middle part much the same - Latter part made sail and steered various courses

Sunday June 18th Commences with a moderate breeze and very hazy steering various courses, at 1 p. m. saw the land, at Sunset took in sail for the night, heading S. W. - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail, steering various courses, saw the land and one sail

Long. 110° 17' W.

Monday June 19th Strong breeze and hazy, heading to the S. and W., Cape St. Lucas bearing E. dist. 10 miles at Sunset took in sail - Middle part the same. Latter part made sail, heading to the N. and E. at 10 a. m. wore Ship heading S. W.

Lat. 22° 40' N.
Long. 110° 18' W.

Tuesday June 20th Strong breeze and hazy, heading S. W., saw Blackfish, lowered but got none at Sunset took in sail for the night. Middle part at 12 o'clock wore Ship heading N. N. E. Latter part made sail heading to the N.

Lat. 22° 23' N.

Wednesday June 21st Strong breeze and hazy weather heading to the N. and E., at 2 p. m. saw the land and kept off E., at 5 p. m. luffed to the wind and double reefed the topsails, heading to the S. W. - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail heading to the N. and E. saw the land. Lat. 22° 17' N. - Long. 110° 00' W.

Thursday June 22nd Light breeze and pleasant weather heading to the N. E. saw Blackfish and a Steamer, at Sunset took in sail and wore Ship heading S. W. - Middle part wore Ship heading to the N. and W. - Latter part much the same, saw Blackfish

Friday June 23rd Light wind and pleasant weather heading to the N. W. the land in sight, at 5 p. m. tacked Ship to the S. W. - Middle part wore Ship heading from N. N. W. to N. N. E. - Latter part tacked Ship heading W. S. W. spoke the Bark J. M. Parker of New Bedford, saw sperm whales, lowered and struck 4 whales, got one boat stove and lost the whale, saved three

Saturday June 24th Light breeze and pleasant weather employed getting the whales along side and cut in one - Middle part lured by the Whales - Latter part finished cutting
