

Sunday June 25th Light breeze and pleasant weather heading to the N. the S. A. Parker in sight, commenced boiling, at 5 p. m. spoke the S. A. Parker, Middle part heading to S. W. Latter part much the same

Monday June 26th

Light breeze and pleasant weather heading to the S. and W. saw sperm Whales mated with the S. A. Parker and got 7 whales Middle part led by the whales - Latter part cut in the whales and made sail heading to the N.

Tuesday June 27th

Light breeze and pleasant weather heading to the N. employed clearing away the heads and commenced boiling, at Sunset wore ship heading to the S. and W. with a fresh breeze Middle part much the same Latter part wore ship heading to the N.

Wednesday June 28th Light breeze and pleasant employed boiling, the S. A. Parker in company with us Middle and Latter part the same

Lat. 22° 10' N.

Thursday June 29th Light air and calm, saw sperm Whales and got one and finished boiling - Latter part saw Whales and got 4 commenced cutting, Cape St Lucas in sight

Friday June 30th Commenced with a calm, finished cutting and commenced boiling. Middle part had a brace heading W. by S. Latter part at day light saw sperm whales and got 3

Saturday July 1st Employed breaking out and clearing up the deck. Middle part stowed some Oil and employed boiling - Latter part employed cutting

Sunday July 2nd Strong breeze and rugg employed boiling - Middle and Latter part the same

Monday July 3rd Strong breeze and rugg heading to S. W. employed boiling - Middle part the same Latter part wore ship heading to the N. and E. employed boiling. Lat 21° 01' N. Long 110° 10' W.

Tuesday July 4th Light breeze and pleasant weather heading to the N. and E. finished boiling - Middle part heading N. N. E. - Latter part employed breaking out and stowing Oil. Lat. 21° 43' N.

Wednesday July 5th Light breeze and pleasant weather heading from N. to N. W. employed stowing Oil - Middle part the same - Latter part employed stowing Oil, saw sperm whales, lowered 3 boats and got 2

Thursday July 6th Light breeze and pleasant weather, employed cutting in the whales, Middle part cleared away the heads and commenced boiling - Latter part the same Lat. 21° 41' N. Long 108° 50' W.
