

Tuesday Dec 12th Light breeze and pleasant, heading to the N. E., employed repairing the main sail Middle part the same Latter part tacked to the S. W., employed on the main sail. Lat. 12° 37' S. Long. 83° 20' W.

Wednesday Dec 13th Light breeze and fair heading to the S. W., employed on the main sail, at sunset took in the light sails and tacked to the N. E. Middle part the same - Latter part saw sperm whales and lowered 3 boats

Thursday Dec 14th Light breeze and pleasant struck 3 whales and saved them and took them along side - Middle part laying by the whales Latter part commenced cutting

Friday Dec 15th Light breeze and hazy, finished cutting and cleared away the heads, made sail heading to the E. - Middle part commenced boiling Latter part wore ship heading to the S. W. Lat. 11° 55' S.

Saturday Dec 16th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S. W., employed boiling - Middle and Latter part the same Lat. 12° 25' S. Long. 83° 31' W.

Sunday Dec 17th Light breeze and pleasant, heading to the S. W., employed boiling, at 5 p. m. wore ship to the N. and E. - Middle part finished boiling - Latter part closed up and washed up deck heading S. S. W. Lat. 12° 25' S. Long. 83° 29' W.

Monday Dec 18th Strong breeze and hazy heading S. W. by S, at sunset took in sail and tacked to the N. and E. - Middle part the same - Latter part bent the main sail - Lat. 12° 12' S. Long. 82° 53' W.

Tuesday Dec 19th Commenced with a strong breeze and rugged steering E. N. E., at sunset took in the main sail and luffed to the wind heading S. by E. - Middle part the same - Latter part wore ship to the S. W., employed cooping oil. Lat. 12° 05' S. - Long 82° 48' W.

Wednesday Dec 20th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S. W., employed cooping oil, one sail in sight - Middle part wore ship to the N. E. - Latter part employed stowing oil Lat. 12° 36' S. Long. 82° 23' W.

Thursday Dec 21st Light breeze and hazy heading to the N. E., employed stowing oil, spoke the ship Courier of New Bedford - Middle part heading to the S. W. - Latter part stowed to the N. & W., a number of sails in sight, finished stowing of the hold. Lat. 12° 11' S. - Long. 83° 15' W.

Friday Dec 22nd Light breeze and pleasant steering N. E. by E., spoke the Harbinger of Westport employed washing ship, 3 sails in sight - Middle part tacked to S. W. - Latter part the same, 2 sails in sight Lat. 12° 20' S. Long. 83° 23' W.
