

Wednesday May 16th Strong breeze and pleasant heading
N. W. 2 sails in sight, at 4 p. m. saw Black
fish struck one but lost him, wore ship
heading N. N. E. - Middle part the same
Latter part heading in shore with all sail out
one sail in sight. Lat. 22° 49' N. Long. 110° 06' W.

Thursday May 17th Light breeze and pleasant heading
N. N. E., at half past one the Capt went on
shore to St. Lucas and returned again at
5 o'clock, at sunset took in sail for the night.
heading of shore - Middle part the same
Latter part made all sail, employed mending
the main top sail. Lat. 22° 04' N. Long. 110° 45' W.

Friday May 18th Light breeze and haze heading S. W.
by W., at sunset took in the light sails and
tacked ship heading N. N. E. - Middle part
the same. Latter part mended the fore sail
Lat. 22° 14' N. Long. 110° 48' W.

Saturday May 19th Light winds and calm heading in
shore Ends much the same 3 sails in sight
Lat. 22° 34' N. 110° 28' W.

Sunday May 20th Light breeze and pleasant saw Black
fish and spoke the John A. Parker heading to
the S. W. - Middle and Latter part strong
breeze, one sail in sight. Lat. 22° 22' N. Long. 110° 58' W.

Monday May 21st Strong breeze and rugged took in
the light sails heading to the S. W. 2 sails in
sight, at sunset double reefed the top sails and
wore ship to the N. E. - Middle part wore ship
to the S. W. - Latter part wore round again to the N.
and E. 2 sails in sight. Lat. 22° 18' N.
Long. 111° 09' W.

Tuesday May 22nd Strong breeze and rugged heading
S. S. E. with all prudent sail out, at 4 p. m. passed
the ship William Lu of New-port and the
Bark John A. Parker and wore ship to the S. W.
at sunset took in sail and wore ship to the N.
Middle part and Latter part the same 3 sails in
sight. Lat. 22° 56' N. Long. 111° 15' W.

Wednesday May 23rd Strong wind and rugged heading
N. N. E. one sail in sight, at took in sail and
wore ship of shore, the land in sight - Middle
part the same - Latter part made sail and tacked
ship heading N. by E. Lat. 22° 24' N. Long. 112° 00' W.

Thursday May 24th Strong breeze and rugged heading
N. by E. with all prudent sail out. Middle part
at half past 10 tacked to the W. and at 2 o'clock tacked
back again to the N. E. - Latter part the same 2 sails
in sight. Lat. 23° 30' N. Long. 111° 16' W.

Friday May 25th Strong breeze and rugged heading in
shore with the land in sight, at 3 p. m. tacked ship
to the S. and W. one sail in sight - Middle part
the same - Latter part tacked to the N. and E.
2 sails in sight. Lat. 23° 17' N. Long. 111° 48' W.

Saturday May 26th Strong breeze and haze heading to the
N. spoke the ship Catawba of Nantucket and
the Bark Statira of New Bedford - Middle
part the same - Latter part tacked to the N.
2 sails in sight. Lat. 23° 29' N. Long. 111° 43' W.

Sunday May 27th Light breeze and foggy heading N.
one sail in sight, at sunset tacked ship to the S. W.
Middle part the same. Latter part made all sail heading
to the N., one sail in sight. Lat. 23° 48' N.
