

Monday May 28th Light breeze and foggy heading N. by W. spoke the John A. Parker, at Sunset took in the light sails and wore Ship heading S. W. the land in sight Middle and Latter part the same 2 sails in sight. Lat. 23° 19' N. Long. 112° 20'

Tuesday May 29th Light breeze and pleasant heading N. with all sail out, spoke the Bark Hydaspes Cpt Snow 550 sp., at Sunset took in the light sails - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail, 3 sails in sight Lat. 23° 26' N. Long. 112° 08'

Wednesday May 30th Light breeze and hazy heading S. W., 2 sails in sight, at Sunset tacked Ship to the N. E. Middle part tacked of shore, Latter part tacked back again, a number of sails in sight. Lat. 23° 05' Long. 112° 29'

Thursday May 31st Light breeze and hazy heading to the N. with all sail out, spoke the Bark Marie Frances at Sunset took in the light sails, 8 sails in sight passed the John A. Parker boiling - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail, 5 sails in sight Lat. 23° 19' N. Long. 112° 29' W.

Friday June 1st Light breeze and pleasant heading to the N. and E. with all sails out 4 sails in sight, at Sunset tacked Ship to the S. W. - Middle part the same - Latter part saw 8 sails and Blackfish lowered the boats but got none

Saturday June 2nd Strong breeze and rugged, 7 sails in sight passed the Ship Betsey Williams of New Bedford. Middle and Latter part the same, a number of sails in sight. Lat. 23° 13' N. Long. 112° 35' W.

Sunday June 3rd Strong wind and rugged heading to the N. and E. with all prudent sail out, a number of sails in sight at 5 p. m. Tacked Ship to the W. Middle part light breeze heading N. W. - Latter part calm, 4 sails in sight. Lat. 23° 27' N. Long. 112° 24' W.

Monday June 4th Light air and pleasant 3 sails in sight the Ship heading W. N. W., spoke the Ship carrier of Nantucket, saw Blackfish and got 2. - Middle part the same - Latter part at 6 a. m. saw some Ships whaling lowered all the boats and got one

Tuesday June 5th Light wind and pleasant the boats in chase of the whales struck 2 more and saved one, employed cutting - Middle part at half past 4 took the whale along side - Latter part cut him in, a number of sails in sight. Lat. 23° 19' N. Long. 112° 14' W.

Wednesday June 6th Light breeze and pleasant a number of sails in sight, employed clearing away the heads and commenced boiling - Middle part the same - Ends the same a number of sails in sight. Lat. 23° 19' N.

Thursday June 7th Strong breeze and hazy employed boiling a number of sails in sight, spoke the Bark Catalpa of New Bedford, at Sunset finished boiling - Ends the same - Lat. 23° 48' N. Long. 112° 04' W.

Friday June 8th Strong breeze and hazy, passed the Ships Panther of New Bedford and Constitution of Nantucket both with a Whale along side cutting, a number of other sails in sight - Latter part saw some Ships whaling made all sail, employed stowing down oil
