

Saturday June 9th Saw a number of ships chasing whales
lowered our boats but got nothing, saw one ship
get a whale, one cutting and 2 boiling, at
Sunset spoke the Catawba - Ends the same
Lat. 23° 34' N. Long. 112° 05' W.

Sunday June 10th Strong breeze and pleasant heading
various courses, 4 sails in sight - Ends the same
Lat. 23° 39' N. Long. 112° 20' W.

Monday June 11th Strong breeze and rugged
some sails in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 23° 39'
Long. 112° 35' W.

Tuesday June 12th Strong breeze and rugged, 5 sails
in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 23° 24' N.
Long. 112° 26' W.

Wednesday June 13th Strong wind and rugged the ship
under easy sail, a number of sails in sight
Ends the same. Lat. 23° 32' N. Long. 112° 31' W.

Thursday June 14th Light breeze and hazy, spoke the
ships Betsey Williams of New Bedford and
Catawba of Nantucket - Ends the same
Lat. 23° 23' N. Long. 112° 28' W.

Friday June 15th Light air and pleasant employed in
various ways, bent a new Spanker, 7 sails in
sight - Ends the same. Lat. 23° 35' Long. 112° 25' W.

Saturday June 16th Light breeze and hazy steering S. by E.
at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind
heading S. W. by S. - Middle part the same
Latter part made sail and steered E.

Sunday June 17th Light wind and hazy steering E. N. E.
2 sails in sight spoke the sk. Marie Frances
Middle part layd with the main top sail
a back heading to the S. - Latter part steered
E. Lat. 22° 52' N. Long. 110° 48' W.

Monday June 18th Light breeze and hazy steering S. E.
spoke the ships William Rutch, Hesper
and Bark John A. Parker - Ends the
same 3 sails in sight. Lat.

Tuesday June 19th Light breeze and pleasant, 2 sails in sight
spoke the ship William Rutch and let her have
10 bls of flour - Ends with a strong breeze
Lat. 22° 06' N. Long. 110° 56' W.

Wednesday June 20th Strong breeze and hazy steering
N. E. 3 sails in sight - Middle part heading by
the wind - Latter part saw sperm whales,
lowered and got 3 and one boat stove,
Lat. 21° 48' N. Long. 110° 49' W.

Thursday June 21st Employed cutting in the whales
Middle part cleared a way the heads and commenced
boiling - Ends the same. Lat. 21° 47' Long. 110° 50' W.

Friday June 22nd Light breeze and pleasant, employed
boiling, one sail in sight - Middle part the same
Latter part finished boiling. Lat. 21° 59' Long. 111° 11' W.

Saturday June 23rd Light breeze and pleasant heading
to the S. and W. at sunset took in sail and hauled
a back the main top sail - Middle part the same
Latter part steered N. E., spoke the John A.
Parker. Lat. 22° 16' N. Long. 110° 26' W.
