

Monday Sept 10th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the W. at 6 p.m. spoke the Ship *Procius* of New Bedford. Middle part wore ship to the S. E. Latter part tacked again to the W. employed in the hold

Tuesday Sept 11th Light breeze and hazy heading to the W. one sail in sight, employed in the hold at sunset wore ship to the S. E. - Middle part the same - Latter part 2 sails in sight.
Lat. 60° 26' N. Long. 81° 21' W.

Wednesday Sept. 12th Light breeze and hazy steering S. E. by S. 2 sails in sight at 5 p.m. saw sperm whales, lowered and got one - Middle part layd by the whale - Latter part cut him in, and made sail steering various courses. Lat. 60° 41' N.
 Long. 80° 59' W.

Thursday Sept. 13th Light breeze and pleasant steering N. W. employed clearing away the whale and commenced boiling, at sunset luffed to the wind and took in sail for the night heading to the W. Middle part wore ship to the S. E. - Latter part wore round again to the W., 2 sails in sight, employed boiling. Lat. 1° 15' N. Long. 81° 10' W.

Friday Sept. 14th Light breeze and hazy heading to the W. 2 sails in sight, finished boiling - Middle part wore ship to the S. E. - Latter part 3 sails in sight saw sperm whales lowered and got 4, and one boat stove



Saturday Sept 15th Strong breeze and hazy employed latching the whales along side and commenced cutting Middle part getting the boats ready and clearing up the decks - Latter part finished cutting and cleared away the heads, one sail in sight

Sunday Sept 16th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the S. E., commenced boiling - Middle part wore ship to the W. - Latter part the same employed boiling, 4 sails in sight

Monday Sept. 17th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the W., employed boiling, 4 sails in sight at 5 p.m. wore ship to the W. E. - Middle part the same - Latter part finished boiling and washed the decks. Lat 60° 15' N. Long. 81° 24' W.

Tuesday Sept. 18th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the W. saw the Bark *Judson* of New Bedford take 2 Hump backs and a number of sails in sight, spoke the *Harpor* of Fair Haven - Middle part layd a back heading to the S. E. - Latter part made sail, saw black fish and got 2, one sail in sight. Lat 60° 39' N.

Wednesday Sept. 19th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S. E. at half past 1 p.m. saw the land, tacked ship to the W., employed clearing away the black fish Middle part the same - Latter part 2 sails in sight employed cooping oil

Thursday Sept 20th Light breeze and hazy heading to the W. at 2 p.m. spoke the Bark *John A. Parker* Middle part heading to the S. E. - Latter part wore ship to the W. employed stowing down oil 2 sails in sight
