

Friday Sept. 21st Light breeze and hazy heading to the W. finished stowing oil and boiled out the black fish at half past 5 p.m. spoke the Bark Domingo of New Bedford. Middle part headed to the S.E. Latter part the same 3 sails in sight

Saturday Sept. 22nd Light breeze and hazy heading to the S.E. at half past 1 p.m. spoke the Bark Benjamin Cummings of New Bedford Capt. Jenkins 10 months out 130 bls sp. Middle part layd aback heading to the W. Latter part steered N. 2 sails in sight

Sunday Sept. 23rd Strong breeze and rugged with dark cloudy weather stering N.E. till 2 o'clock and then steered E. N.E. till sunset, wore ship to the W. and double reefed the top sails 2 sails in sight - Middle part the same - Latter part saw sperm whales lowered and got one Lat. 1° 25' N. Long. 80° 45' W.

Monday Sept. 24th Strong breeze and rugged, took the whale along side and cut him in, made sail heading to the W. - Middle part the same Latter part headed to the S.E. commenced boiling

Tuesday Sept. 25th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S.E. finished boiling. Middle part headed to the W. Latter part headed to the S.E., one sail in sight. Lat. 1° 48' N. Long. 80° 27' W.

Wednesday Sept. 26th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., one sail in sight, at half past 2 p.m. saw sperm whales going to the wind ward very quick did not lower, wore the sail to the wind ward strike a whale at sunset took in the light sails - Middle part the same - Latter part made all sail 2 sails in sight

Thursday Sept. 27th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S.E. 2 sails in sight, at 4 p.m. took to the W., spoke the Susan of New Bedford, at sunset took in the light sails - Middle part heading to the W. - Latter part wore ship and made sail heading to the S.E. 2 sails in sight. Lat. 20° 50' N. Long. 80° 50' W.

Friday Sept. 28th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S.E. spoke the Bark A. R. Tucker - Middle part layd aback heading to the N.W. - Latter part made sail and steered N.W. 2 sails in sight. Lat. 20° 50' N.

Saturday Sept. 29th Light breeze and hazy steering N. N.W. spoke the Bark Hydaspes of New Bedford and headed to the S.E. - Middle part headed to the W. - Latter part the same, one sail in sight. Lat. 1° 30' N. Long. 81° 36' W.

Sunday Sept. 30th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the W. employed mending sails, one sail in sight, at sunset double reefed the topsails. Middle part the same heading to the S.E. - Latter part more moderate but the reefs out the top sails heading to the W., one sail in sight.

Monday Oct. 1st Strong breeze and rugged heading to the S.E. Middle part heading to the W. Latter part heading to the S.E. 3 sails in sight. Lat. 1° 45' N. Long. 81° 23' W.
