

Monday Nov 5th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E.
6 sails in sight, at 5 p.m. tacked off shore - Middle
part the same - Latter part headed to the S.E.,
3 sails in sight. Lat. 1° 05' S. Long. 81° 13' W.

Tuesday Nov 6th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S.E.
4 sails in sight, saw blackfish and towed one boat
but got none, at dark tacked ship to the W.
Middle part the same - Latter part headed to the
S.E., saw plenty of blackfish but could not get any
6 sails in sight Lat. 1° 44' S. Long. 81° 01' W.

Wednesday Nov 7th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the
S.E., 9 sails in sight - Middle part headed off shore
Latter part headed to the S.E., 5 sails in sight
Lat. 2° 22' S. Long. 81° 08' W.

Thursday Nov 8th Light breeze and hazy heading to the W.
4 sails in sight - Middle and Latter part the same
one sail in sight. Lat. 2° 09' S. Long. 81° 51' W.

Friday Nov 9th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E. one
sail in sight - Middle and Latter part heading to
the W., one sail in sight. Lat. 2° 23' S. Long. 82° 16' W.

Saturday Nov 10th Light breeze and hazy heading to the W., spoke
the bark Heydeaspe - Middle and Latter part
much the same Lat. 2° 40' S. Long. 82° 03' W.

Sunday Nov 11th Strong breeze and squalls heading to the S.E.
spoke the Heydeaspe - Middle and Latter part the
same, one sail in sight. Lat. 3° 34' S. Long. 82° 45' W.

Monday Nov 12th Strong breeze and hazy working to windward
one sail in sight Middle and Latter part much the
same, employed in the hulls. Lat. 4° 11' S.
Long. 83° 01' W.

Tuesday Nov 13th Strong breeze and rugged with squalls of rain
working to the windward, saw 3 sails, employed in various
ways. Ends much the same. no Lat.

Wednesday Nov 14th Light breeze and rain working to the
windward - Middle and Latter part the same.
Lat. 5° 19' S. Long. 82° 31' W.

Thursday Nov 15th Light breeze and hazy working to the
windward - Middle part the same - Latter part at
day light saw Point Payta bearing N.E. dist. 40 miles

Friday Nov 16th Light breeze and pleasant weather steering
N.E. for Point Payta, at half past 4 p.m. we hauled
a bark of Payta when the Cpt took a boat and went
one shore with his wife and Mr. Hill, our mate
Mr. Hill being sick, he went to see the Doctor, at
Sunset the boat returned leaving the Cpt. and his
wife and Mr. Hill on shore, made sail on the ship
and stood out to sea - Middle part the same
Latter part made all sail and worked in to the
bay, at half past 8 a.m. sent a boat on shore, the ship
standing off and on 2 other sails the same, the A.R.
Lucker and Heydeaspe

Saturday Nov 17th Strong breeze and clear standing off and on
off Payta, at 2 p.m. the boat returned with some
potatoes and onions, and went on shore again with 5
bbls of slush and one sick man that is going to leave
here, at Sunset the boat returned with some more
potatoes, made sail and stood off shore. Middle
part the same - Latter part stood in shore and got in
to the bay at noon
