

Saturday Dec. 29th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S. W., 4 sails in sight, at 2 p. m. kept the ship of N. till 4 p. m. when we luffed to the wind heading to the E. Middlepart headed to the S. W. - Latterpart the same 4 sails in sight

Sunday Dec. 30th Light breeze and hazy heading to the S. W. 6 sails and Woods Island in sight, spoke the bks Sea breeze and Atlantic - Middlepart heading to the S. W. - Latterpart stored various courses. Lat. 1° 34' S.

Monday Dec. 31st Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E., 4 sails in sight, at sunset took in sail for the night Middlepart at one o'clock wore ship to the S. W. and hauled back the main top sail. Latterpart made all sail heading to the W. 2 sails in sight

Tuesday January 1st 1856
Commences with a light breeze and fine pleasant weather, heading to the E. with all sail out, at 4 p. m. Woods Island bearing N. dist. 20 miles, 3 sails in sight at sunset took in the light sails - Ends heading to the S. W. with all sail out

Wednesday Jan. 2nd Light breeze and hazy, heading to the S. W., spoke the bks Atlantic and Mary Frances - Ends, heading to the E.

Thursday Jan. 3rd Commences with a fresh breeze and fair weather heading to the E., bent a new fore top sail, 3 sails in sight - Ends steering to the W., employed making a mizen stay sail out of the old fore top sail

Friday Jan. 4th Light breeze and thick hazy weather heading to the E., employed making and bending the mizen stay sail, spoke the bks Superior of New Bedford - Ends heading to the W., employed in ship duty

Saturday Jan. 5th Light breeze and very hazy heading to the S. W. Woods Island and 2 sails in sight, at sunset tacked ship to the E. and took in sail for the night Middlepart the same - Latterpart made all sail heading to the S. W., employed in ship duty 2 sails in sight

Sunday Jan. 6th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E. spoke the bks Atlantic - Middlepart much the same - Latterpart strong breeze steering to the W. one sail in sight

Monday Jan. 7th Commences with a strong breeze and dark cloudy weather, steering W. 1/2 N., at sunset stored W. 1/2 S. Charles Island bearing N. dist. 15 miles - Middlepart luffed with the main top sail a back - Latterpart headed in for Charles Island, at 9 a. m. 2 boats went on shore a fishing, the ship standing off and on

Tuesday Jan. 8th Light breeze and pleasant the ship standing off and on, 2 boats on shore, at 5 p. m. the boats returned with a number of fish, made all sail heading to the W. the wind very light - Middlepart the same - Latterpart a fresh breeze, a number of the Galapagos Islands in sight, employed in various ways Lat. 1° 28' S.

Wednesday Jan. 9th Commences with a moderate breeze and hazy heading to the S. W., with all sail out, bent a new fore sail and a new main top gallant sail - Ends much the same Lat. 2° 16' S.
