

Saturday Febr. 9th Commences with a strong double reefed top sail breeze from the N., took in the jib and spanker, at 5 p. m. close reefed the top sails, it blowing a moderate Gale the Ship heading N. E. - Middle part the same - Latter part more moderate, shook the reefs out the top sails, steering N. E. the wind from the N. W. - Lat. 35° 18' S. Long. 82° 35' W.

Sunday Febr. 10th Strong wind from the N. W. and hazy, steering N. E. by N. with all prudent sail out, at sunset double reefed the top sails - Middle part the wind very light from the S. W. Latter part the same, made all sail steering N. E. by N. Lat. 34° 14' S. Long. 81° 06' W.

Monday Febr. 11th Light breeze from the S. W. and pleasant weather steering N. E. by N. with all sail out, at half past 2 p. m. saw the Island Massafuero dist. 40 miles bearing N. E. and steered N. E. by E., at sunset double reefed the top sails and luffed to the wind heading to the S. and E. Massafuero dist. 20 miles bearing N. E. by N. - Middle part the same - Latter part made all sail and steered for the Island

Tuesday Febr. 12th Light breeze and pleasant weather, sent 2 boats on shore a fishing the Ship laying off the Island, at sunset the boats returned with some fish, made sail and headed to the E. with the wind from the S. - Middle part the same - Latter part calm, employed in the hold, Massafuero in sight. Lat. 33° 50' S. Long. 79° 45' W.

Wednesday Febr. 13th Commences with a calm and pleasant weather employed in the hold, Massafuero in sight - Middle part a light variable wind from the W. steering N. E. by E. Latter part much the same, saw one sail and the Island Juan Fernandez dist 60 miles Lat. 34° 35' S. Long. 78° 55' W.

Thursday Febr. 14th Light breeze from the W. and pleasant weather steering S. E. by E., employed in Ship duty, at 5 p. m. the wind hauled to the S. W. Middle part the wind from the S., heading E. S. E. Latter part the same, saw a sail, employed setting up shovels Lat. 35° 40' S. Long. 77° 48' W.

Friday Febr. 15th Commences with a light air from the S. and pleasant weather heading to the E., employed setting up shovels, one sail in sight - Middle part headed to the S. W. - Latter part tacked to the E., employed setting up shovels Lat. 35° 55' S. Long. 77° 22' W.

Saturday Febr. 16th Light breeze and pleasant weather heading to the S. and E., with the wind from the S. and W., employed setting up shovels, caught a Sunfish - Middle part the same - Latter part sent down the fore royal and top gallant yards, the fore top mast cross trees being broke - Lat. 36° 24' S. Long. 75° 59' W.

Sunday Febr. 17th Commences with a light breeze and pleasant weather steering E. by S., the wind S., at sunset a strong breeze double reefed the top sails and furlled the main sail Middle part the same - Latter part blowing a Gale, close reefed the top sails, one sail in sight. Lat. 36° 34' S. Long. 74° 03' W.

Monday Febr. 18th Commences with a moderate Gale from the S. with all prudent sail out heading E. by S., at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Middle part a 12 o'clock wore Ship to the E. Latter part quite moderate made all sail steering E., a number of sails in sight, ends with a calm and foggy

Tuesday Febr. 19th Commences with a calm and foggy, employed in various ways, at 2 p. m. it cleared up with a light breeze from the W. saw the Coast of Chili dist 10 miles and steered N. E. for Talcahuano, at 5 p. m. luffed to and spoke the Ship Uncoas of N. Bedford at half past 7 p. m. wore Ship to the S. W. - Middle part calm Latter part a light breeze from the S., steered for Talcahuano 2 sails in sight
