Saturday March 15th Commences with clear weather, the wind still from the N., employed painting - Ends much the same

Sunday March 16th First part employed painting - Latter part one watch on liberty

Monday March 17th Commences with fine pleasant weather one watch on liberty - Latter part assisting the Ship George Washington she being set on fire in the night

Tuesday March 18th Commences with fine pleasant weather one watch on liberty, the Steward absent - Ends with rainy weather

Wednesday March 19th Commences with rainy weather, one watch on liberty the Steward deserted - Latter part got some Potatoes on board and employed in various other ways

Thursday March 20th Commences with pleasant weather, employed in various ways, one watch on liberty - Ends with rainy weather

Friday March 21st Commences with rainy weather, one watch on liberty - Latter part pleasant weather, employed in various ways

Saturday March 22nd Commences with pleasant weather, employed in various ways, one watch on liberty - Latter part took some flour on board

Sunday March 23rd First part employed putting up flour and took the rest of the flour on board, one watch on liberty - Ends the same

Monday March 24th First part pleasant weather, one watch on liberty - Latter part employed in the hold

Tuesday March 25th First part pleasant weather, employed in various ways, one watch on liberty, took our recruits on board - Latter part employed sending up the fore top gallant mast and yard

Wednesday March 26th Commences with pleasant weather, employed in various ways - Ends much the same

Thursday March 27th First part employed clearing up the deck and getting ready for sea - Latter part at 7 a.m. took our Anchor and hauled clear of the Shipping, at 11 a.m. the Cpt. came on board, spread all sail and stood out to sea

Friday March 28th Commences with pleasant weather, Storing N.W. by W., employed stowing chains and anchors, clearing up and washing the deck, the Ship Cataroba in company with us - Middle part the wind very light from the S.W. - Latter part the wind hauled to the N. with thick rainy weather, the Ship heading to the W. no Obs.

Saturday March 29th Commences with a strong breeze from the N.W. and thick rainy weather, the Ship heading to the S.W. under easy sail, one sail in sight - Middle part the same - Latter part calm, saw Blackfish and got 3 - Lat. 35° 46' N. Long. 74° 46' W.

Sunday March 30th Commences with a calm, employed clearing away the Blackfish, one sail in sight - Middle part calm - Latter part a light air from the S.E., storing N.W. 1/2 N. - Lat. 35° 16' N. Long. 74° 56' W.

Monday March 31st Commences with a light air from the S., storing N.W. 1/2 N., one sail in sight - Middle part strong breeze - Latter part the same, employed boiling Blackfish, one sail in sight

Lat. 33° 45' N.
Long. 75° 38' W.
