

Tuesday Apr. 1st Commences with a strong breeze from the S., steering N. & W., employed boiling blackfish - Ends much the same
Lat. 31° 36' S. Long. 76° 10' W.

Wednesday Apr. 2nd Strong breeze from the S. and pleasant weather steering N. & W., employed in various ways, saw a sail Middle part the same - Latter part stored N. by W. Lat. 29° 26' S.

Thursday Apr. 3rd Strong breeze from the S. E. steering N. by W., at Sunset double reefed the top sails and furled the fore sail and luffed to the wind heading to the N. and E. - Middle part wore ship to the S. - Latter part headed to the E. with all prudent sail out, spoke the Blk Morning Star of New Bedford - Lat. 28° 46' S. Long. 76° 43' W.

Friday Apr. 4th Commences with a strong double reefed top sails breeze heading to the E., 3 sails in sight, at Sunset took in sail for the night - Middle part it blowed a Gale - Latter part the same steering N. - Lat. 28° 07' S. Long. 75° 03' W.

Saturday Apr. 5th Strong breeze from the S., steering N. E. under double reefed top sails, at 4 p.m. wore ship to the S. W. Middle part the same - Latter part wore ship to the E. and made sail - Lat. 27° 41' S. Long. 74° 55' W.

Sunday Apr. 6th Commences with a moderate breeze from the S. E. the ship heading E. with all sail out, at Sunset took in sail for the night and wore ship to the S. W. - Middle part the same - Latter part made all sail, the wind very light Lat. 28° 04' S. Long. 75° 12' W.

Monday Apr. 7th Commences with a calm, at Sunset a light breeze from the S., heading to the E. - Middle part the same - Latter part stored N. E., employed in various ways. Lat. 28° 04' S. Long. 74° 30' W.

Tuesday Apr. 8th Commences with a fresh breeze from the S., steering N. E., employed in various ways and put out a new starboard boat, at Sunset double reefed the top sails and luffed to the wind heading to the E. - Middle part strong breeze - Latter part the same, steering N. E. by N. one sail in sight Lat. 27° 14' S. Long. 73° 11' W.

Wednesday Apr. 9th Strong breeze from the S., steering N. E. by E., employed in ship duty, at Sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind heading to the E. - Middle part the same - Latter part made all sail and stored N. E. by N. - Lat. 26° 28' S. Long. 72° 12' W.

Thursday Apr. 10th Strong breeze from the S. steering N. E. by S. with all sail out, at Sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind heading to the E. - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail and stored N. E. No Obs.

Friday Apr. 11th Light breeze from the S. steering N. E., at 4 p.m. saw the Coast of South America in Lat. 25° 45' S. dist 30 miles and wore ship to the S. W., at Sunset took in sail for the night - Middle part the same - Latter part made sail and stored N. E. saw some finbacks - Lat. 25° 24' S. Long. 70° 59' W.

Saturday Apr. 12th Strong breeze from the S. steering N. E. at Sunset wore ship to the S. W. and took in sail for the night - Latter part made sail and stored N. E. No Obs.

Sunday Apr. 13th Light breeze from the S. with cloudy weather steering N. E. at 4 p.m. luffed to the wind heading to the S. W., at Sunset took in sail for the night - Latter part made all sail and stored N. E., got 16 Blk fish

Monday Apr. 14th Light breeze and pleasant weather, steering N. E. one sail in sight, employed clearing a way the blackfish, at Sunset strong breeze, double reefed the top sails and wore ship to the W. - Latter part made sail, steering to the N. and E., the Coast in sight - Lat. 23° 28' S. Long. 70° 52' W.
