

Tuesday May 27th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E., spoke the Bk's Paulina and Hercules - Middle and Latter part the same, Culppeper in sight. Lat. 1° 56' N. Long. 92° 16' W.

Wednesday May 28th Light air and pleasant, heading to the S. E. with the wind from S. W., 4 sails and Culppeper in sight - Latter part employed filling up some casks with water in the hold, 5 sails in sight Lat. 2° 18' N. Long. 91° 56' W.

Thursday May 29th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E., 5 sails in sight Ends the same. Lat. 2° 36' N. Long. 91° 49' W.

Friday May 30th Light air and pleasant, heading to the S. W., 5 sails in sight, spoke the Ship, Mary Wilder and the Bk Paulina - Ends with a calm, 3 sails in sight. Lat. 2° 55' N. Long. 92° 20' W.

Saturday May 31st Commences with a light air and pleasant heading S. W., 3 sails in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 2° 39' N. Long. 92° 14' W.

Sunday Mayne 1st Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E., 2 sails in sight - Latter part strong breeze, saw sperm whales and lowered the boats, the larboard boat went along side of one, but the boatstover missed him, the Paulina and Franklin got one a piece, came on board and made all sail heading to the S. and E. Lat. 2° 59' N. Long. 92° 01' W.

Monday June 2nd Strong breeze and pleasant heading to the S. E., at Sunset tacked the W. - Middle part at 12 o'clock tacked to the S. E. - Latter part 3 sails in sight, saw whales to the wind ward going to the windward, did not lower the boats, saw the Paulina chasing whales, and started for her. No lts

Tuesday June 3rd Strong breeze and rugged, heading to the E. with all sail out, 4 sails in sight, passed the Franklin cutting, at Sunset tacked Ship to the W. - Middle part at 11 o'clock tacked Ship to the S. E. - Latter part the same, 3 sails in sight - Lat. 2° 43' N. Long. 91° 04' W.

Wednesday June 4th Commences with a fresh breeze and pleasant weather heading to the S. E. with all sail out, 4 sails in sight, at Sun set tacked Ship to the W. - Latter part heading to the E., employed making a spanker gaff - Lat. 2° 48' N. Long. 91° 42' W.

Thursday June 5th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S. W., one sail in sight, employed making spanker gaff - Latter part tacked to the E., one sail in sight Lat. 2° 45' N. Long. 92° 29' W.

Friday June 6th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the S. W., one sail in sight, employed on the spanker gaff - Latter part tacked to the E. Lat. 2° 25' N. Long. 93° 02' W.

Saturday June 7th Strong breeze and pleasant weather heading to the E., sent up the new spanker gaff, at half past 4 p. m. saw sperm whales and got 2 - Middle part layd by the whales - Latter part employed cutting them in, saw more sperm whales and got 2 more, one sail in sight - Ends the boats chasing the whales

Sunday June 8th Strong breeze and pleasant weather, took the whales along side, the boats chasing the whales, at Sunset the boats came on board - Middle part employed clearing the deck and cutting up the first 2 whales - Latter part employed cutting. Lat. 4° 05' N. Long. 93° 58' W.

Monday June 9th Strong breeze and rugged, employed clearing away the heads and commenced boiling, one sail in sight, at Sunset wore Ship to the E. - Ends the same, employed boiling - Lat. 4° 04' N. Long. 92° 15' W.

Tuesday June 10th Strong breeze and fair weather heading to the S. and E. employed boiling, spoke the Bk Paulina, Ends the same

Wednesday June 11th Strong breeze and rugged, employed boiling, saw a large whale hauled and got him - Middle part boiling - Latter part cutting, one sail in sight
