

Sunday June 29th Light breeze and pleasant, heading to the S.W., 2 sails in sight at 2 p.m. tacked to the E. - Ends much the same, 3 sail in sight Lat. 2° 29' N. Long. 91° 35' W.

Monday June 30th Strong breeze and rugged, heading to the E., 4 sails in sight spoke the Ship Mary Wilder and Bk Paulina - Ends with a strong breeze, 2 sails in sight - Lat. 2° 40' N. Long. 90° 45' W.

Tuesday July 1st Strong breeze and rugged heading to the E., 2 sails in sight at sunset wore ship to the S.W. - So ends, 2 sails in sight Lat. 2° 23' N.

Wednesday July 2nd Strong breeze and rugged heading to the S.W., 2 sails in sight spoke the Ship Mary Wilder and let her have some coal - Latter part heading to the E., Culpepper and a number of sails in sight Lat. 2° 03' N. Long. 92° 08' W.

Thursday July 3rd Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E., Culpepper and a number of sails in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 2° 21' N. Long. 91° 32' W.

Friday July 4th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E., at sunset tacked ship to the S.W., 4 sails in sight - Latter part spoke the Bk Paulina Lat. 2° 22' N. Long. 92° 39' W.

Saturday July 5th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the E. - Ends much the same, one sail in sight. Lat. 2° 21' N. Long. 92° 32' W.

Sunday July 6th Light breeze and hazy heading to the E., at 2 p.m. the Capt. went on board the Bk. Paulina and returned again at 8 p.m. - Ends much the same, 3 sail in sight. Lat. 3° 00' N. Long. 91° 30' W.

Monday July 7th Light breeze and pleasant, heading to the E., one sail in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 3° 05' N. Long. 90° 38' W.

Tuesday July 8th Strong breeze and pleasant heading to the S. and E., one sail in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 2° 14' N. Long. 89° 25' W.

Wednesday July 9th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the S. and E., 2 sails in sight - Ends the same. Lat. 1° 43' N. Long. 88° 10' W.

Thursday July 10th Fresh breeze and thick hazy weather heading to the S. E. 2 sails in sight - Ends the same - Lat. 1° 13' N.

Friday July 11th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the E. - Ends the same.

Saturday July 12th Strong breeze and rugged with thick cloudy weather, heading to the E. - Ends with a light breeze. Lat. 00° 40' N. Long. 84° 40' W.

Sunday July 13th Light breeze and hazy heading to the E., at sunset took in sail for the night - Ends with a strong breeze. Lat. 00° 35' N. Long. 83° 21' W.

Monday July 14th Strong breeze and thick hazy weather heading to the E. - Ends much the same, spoke the Bk Morning Star. Lat. 00° 11' N. Long. 82° 22' W.

Tuesday July 15th Light breeze and dark cloudy weather, starting E., at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind heading S. E. by E. - Middle part wore ship to the W. - Latter part made all sail, one sail in sight Lat. 00° 33' N.

Wednesday July 16th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the W., spoke the Ship President of New Bedford, Capt. Allen, 9 mts out 300 lbs of, at sunset wore ship to the S. E. - Ends the same, 3 sails in sight

Thursday July 17th Light breeze and pleasant, starting E., 3 sails in sight, spoke the Ship Neutilus of New Bedford - Ends heading W. Lat. 00° 01' N. Long. 81° 41' W.

Friday July 18th Light wind and hazy, starting to the S.W., at sunset luffed to the W. - Latter part started N.E., rainy weather, so ends

Saturday July 19th Light wind and rainy heading to the S. E., at sunset double reefed the top sails and wore ship to the W. - Middle part wore ship to the S. E. - Latter part strong breeze, so ends. no obs.
