

Monday Aug. 4th Commences with a light breeze and dark cloudy weather, heading S.E., one sail in sight, and sunset tacked to the W. - Latter part wore ship to the S.E. Lat. 1° 18' N. Long. 80° 48' W.

Tuesday Aug. 5th Light breeze and pleasant heading S.E., at sunset tacked to the W. - Ends heading S.E. - Lat. 00° 43' N. Long. 80° 46' W.

Wednesday Aug. 6th Strong breeze and hazy heading S.E., at 3 p.m. tacked to the W. - Ends much the same, employed mending the fore sail. Lat. 1° 02' N. Long. 82° 08' W.

Thursday Aug. 7th Strong breeze and hazy heading W. - Middle part wore to S.E. - Ends the same, mending the jib. Lat. 00° 41' N. Long. 81° 57' W.

Friday Aug. 8th Light breeze and hazy heading S.E., employed mending the main top gallant stay sail. - Ends the same. Lat. 00° 13' N. Long. 81° 37' W.

Saturday Aug. 9th Light breeze and pleasant steering E. by N., at sunset hauled aboard the main top sail heading to the W. - Latter part made sail heading W. N. W. - Lat. 00° 37' N. Long. 82° 00' W.

Sunday Aug. 10th Strong breeze and dark cloudy weather heading to the W. - Ends the same, one sail in sight. Lat. 00° 46' N. Long. 82° 12' W.

Monday Aug. 11th Strong breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., 5 sails in sight, spoke the Ship, Catwaba of Nantucket - Ends much the same - Lat. 00° 36' N. Long. 81° 59' W.

Tuesday Aug. 12th Strong breeze and rugged heading S.E., 4 sails in sight, at 4 p.m. tacked to the W., spoke the Bk Paulina - Latter part spoke the Bk's Paulina and Hooka. Lat. 00° 56' N. Long. 83° 22' W.

Wednesday Aug. 13th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the W., in company with the Bk Hooka and Paulina - Latter part wore ship to the S.E., 4 sails in sight. Lat. 1° 17' N.

Thursday Aug. 14th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S.E., 4 sails in sight saw Blackfish - Latter part wore ship to the W., employed in the hold 8 sails in sight. Lat. 1° 06' N.

Friday Aug. 15th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the W., employed in the hold, spoke the Bk's Paulina and Hooka, 9 sails in sight - Middle part heading to the S.E. - Ends the same. Lat. 00° 40' N. Long. 83° 00' W.

Saturday Aug. 16th Strong breeze and squally heading S.E., 4 sails in sight, employed in the hold - Latter part stored E. by S., 3 sails in sight - No Ob's

Sunday Aug. 17th Strong breeze and dark squally weather, steering E. N. E. at sunset spoke the Bk's Franklin, Carshalot and Paulina - Middle part layd a bark, heading S.E. - Latter part stored to the N., saw the Bk Franklin take a large whale. Lat. 00° 00' Long. 81° 01' W.

Monday Aug. 18th Strong breeze and hazy steering to the N. W., 4 sails in sight, spoke the Bk's Atlantic and Paulina - Middle part stored N. by W. - Latter part stored for Esmeraldas in company with the Paulina, the land in sight

Tuesday Aug. 19th Light breeze and hazy, steering for Esmeraldas, at sunset took in sail and luffed to the wind, heading to the N. W. with the main top sail aback - Latter part made all sail and stored for Esmeraldas

Wednesday Aug. 20th Light breeze and pleasant, at half past 3 p.m. anchored in Esmeraldas river - Latter part employed ship, some men on shore cutting wood and in various other ways

Thursday Aug. 21st Employed in getting water and cutting wood - Ends the same

Friday Aug. 22nd Employed in cutting wood and painting ship

Saturday Aug. 23rd Employed getting wood and water and in various other ways
