Wednesday Aug. 27th Strong breeze and pleasant heading to the W. - Latter part wore Ship to the S.E., 3 sails in sight Lat. $1^{\circ}33' N.$ Long. $80^{\circ}04' W.$

Thursday Aug. 28th Strong breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., 2 sails in sight, at Sunset looked to the W. the land in sight - Ends the same, a number of sails in sight Lat. $1^{\circ}21' N.$ Long. $80^{\circ}51' W.$

Friday Aug. 29th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the W., 3 sails in sight, at 5 p.m. looked to the S.E. - Middle part wore Ship to the W. - Latter part headed to the S.E. - Lat. $1^{\circ}13' N.$ Long. $80^{\circ}30' W.$

Saturday Aug. 30th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S.E., at 4 p.m. looked Ship to the W., the land and one sail in sight - Ends the same, 2 sails in sight Lat. $1^{\circ}27' N.$ Long. $81^{\circ}51' W.$

Sunday Aug. 31st Strong breeze and pleasant heading heading to the W., one sail in sight at 4 p.m. looked Ship to the S.E. - 6 Ends. Lat. $00^{\circ}35' N.$ Long. $80^{\circ}57' W.$

Monday Sept. 1st Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., at half past 5 p.m. spoke the Ship Northern Crown of New York 87 days from Philadelphia bound to Panama - Middle part headed to the W. Latter part looked to the S.E.
Lat. $00^{\circ}18' N.$
Long. $80^{\circ}59' W.$

Tuesday Sept. 2nd Light breeze and hazy heading to the S.E., saw Blackfish and lowered 2 boats but got none, at Sunset wore Ship to the W. Latter part saw sperm whales and got one Lat. $00^{\circ}39' N.$ Long. $81^{\circ}28' W.$

Wednesday Sept. 3rd Light breeze and hazy, employed taking the whale along side ~~and commenced cutting and more whales and lowered for them~~ but without success, came on board again and finished cutting Middle part heading to the W. - Latter part steered E. by S. commenced boiling

Thursday Sept. 4th Light breeze and foggy heading to the S. and E., employed boiling, at Sunset wore Ship to the W. - Latter part wore Ship to the S.E. and finished boiling Lat. $00^{\circ}22' N.$ Long. $81^{\circ}29' W.$

Friday Sept. 5th Light breeze and hazy heading S.E., saw Blackfish and got 2 - Middle part headed to the W. - Latter part wore Ship to the S.E., employed boiling Blackfish, 2 sails in sight

Saturday Sept. 6th Strong breeze and squally with rain heading to the S.E. spoke the Ship Catalpa of Nantucket - Middle part heading to the W. Latter part steered E. N. E. Lat. $00^{\circ}11' N.$ Long. $81^{\circ}12' W.$

Sunday Sept. 7th Light breeze and pleasant, steering S. N. E., 2 sails in sight, at 2 p.m. luffed to the wind heading to the W. - Latter part at daylight saw sperm whales, lowered the boats but could not get on to them, they had seen the Ship and went to the windward one sail in sight Lat. $00^{\circ}51' N.$ Long. $82^{\circ}11' W.$

Monday Sept. 8th Strong breeze and pleasant, the Ship working to the windward after the whales, one sail in sight - Middle part the same - Latter part saw whales again, lowered and struck 2 but lost one, one boat got stove and Mr Swain got hurt by the whale, 2 sails in sight
