

Tuesday Sept 9th Light breeze and pleasant, took the whale along side and cut him in 2 sails in sight, at dark spoke the Ship Catawba - Middle part commences boiling - Latter part heading to the S.E., employed boiling

Wednesday Sept 10th Light breeze and rising heading to the S.E., employed boiling, one sail in sight, at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Middle part finished

Thursday Sept 11th Light breeze and hazy steering to the E., spoke the Ship Catawba at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Latter part headed to the S.E. Lat. 00° 45' N. Long. 82° 41' W.

Friday Sept 12th Strong breeze and rugged heading to the S.E. - Ends much the same - Lat. 00° 14' N. Long. 81° 49' W.

Saturday Sept 13th Strong wind and rugged steering N.W., at sunset luffed to the wind heading to the W., 2 sails in sight - Latter part employed stowing oil, 3 sails in sight. Lat. 00° 28' N.

Sunday Sept 14th Light breeze and hazy steering W. by N., employed stowing oil, one sail in sight, at sunset wore Ship to the S.E. - Ends 2 sails in sight

Monday Sept 15th Light breeze and pleasant, steering to the N. and E., at sunset spoke the Catawba - Middle part luffed a back heading to the W. Latter part headed to the S.E. Lat. 00° 33' N. Long. 81° 40' W.

Tuesday Sept 16th Strong breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., one sail in sight at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Latter part headed to the S.E.

Wednesday Sept 17th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S.E., employed mending the steven boat, at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Ends, 5 sails in sight - Lat. 00° 42' N. Long. 82° 20' W.

Thursday Sept 18th Light breeze and foggy heading to the W., spoke the bk. Helen Inow of New Bedford, 24 mths. out. 700 bls sp. - Middle part headed to the S.E. - Latter part the same. Lat. 00° 23' N. Long. 82° 07' W.

Friday Sept 19th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., spoke the Ship Catawba - Middle part stored N.E. - Ends the same - Lat. 00° 46' N. Long. 82° 24' W.

Saturday Sept 20th Light breeze and pleasant steering to the N. and W., spoke the Ship Clifford Waine and the bk. Franklin - Middle part headed to the W. - Latter part steering E. Lat. 1° 09' N. Long. 81° 29' W.

Sunday Sept 21st Strong breeze and pleasant steering E., at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Ends heading to the S. and E., 2 sails in sight. No Obs.

Monday Sept 22nd Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S. and E., at sunset wore Ship to the W. with the main top sail aback - Latter part headed to the W. Lat. 00° 58' N.

Tuesday Sept 23rd Strong breeze and hazy steering N. by W., at sunset luffed to the wind heading to the W. - Latter part headed to the S.E. Lat. 1° 26' N. Long. 82° 07' W.

Wednesday Sept 24th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S.E. - Ends heading to the W.

Thursday Sept 25th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the W. - Ends heading to the S.E. - Lat. 1° 00' N. Long. 81° 30' W.

Friday Sept 26th Light breeze and pleasant heading to the S.E., at sunset tacked to the W. - Latter part heading to the S.E. Lat. 00° 38' N.

Saturday Sept 27th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S.E., at sunset tacked to the W. - Latter part tacked to the S.E. Lat. 00° 22' N.

Sunday Sept 28th Strong breeze and hazy heading to the S.E., at sunset wore Ship to the W. - Latter part tacked to the S.E.
