Squally middle the same latter part more moderate at 8 light
off E by S saw one finback Lat 35 11 Long 105 32 East

Remarks on Board Saturday 26th Oct
First part Moderate gale from S.W. steering
E by S at dark took in sail and steered S.E. under short
sail middle moderate gale from N.W. steering latter
part Strong breezes from S.W. steering at day light
made sail saw several finbacks on sail in sight

Lat 35 28 Long 108 32 East

Remarks on Board Sunday 27th Oct.

First part Light winds from S.W. steering E saw
several finbacks on sail at dark took in sail
and left for heading S.E. Middle part Light winds from
S.W. heading S.E. latter part Light winds and calm at day light
made sail nothing in sight Lat 35 12 Long 109 45 East

Remarks on Board Monday 28th Oct

First part Light air and calm on sail in sight at
dark took in sail middle Light winds and variable
latter part fine breezes from N.W. heading South at
day light made sail nothing in sight

Remarks on Board Tuesday 29th Oct

First part Brisk Breezes from West steering South
nothing in sight at dark took in sail. Middle part
fresh breeze from N.W. heading South latter part
fresh breeze from S.W. at day Light made sail at
at 9 A.M. spoke the Barclay of Bedford 1300 All
oil at 10 do reefed topsails took in Jib & Main
sail No whales in sight Lat 36 30

Remarks on Board Wednesday 30th Oct 1839

First part of this day Strong Breezes from S.W. heading South
in Company with the Barclay latter part fresh gale from N.W.
at day light do reefed topsails and Main sail and sent in the Jib to repair
at 11 sent the Jib on bent it again and took in the Main at 11 spoke
Barclay saw a shoal of Blackfish No whals

Remarks on Board Thursday 31st Oct

First part Strong Breezes from West heading S.W. at 1 took in
the fore topsail at dark took in the Main topsail middle and
latter part Strong gale and squally weather the Ship Barclay in
sight Lat 35 08 Long 111 44

Remarks on Board Friday 1st Nov 1839

First part fresh gale from West and thick hazy weather at 5 saw
Ship heading North Middle part fresh gale from N.W. heading
N.W. by E and squally weather latter part Strong breezes from N.W.
heading N.W. in Company with the Barclay at day Light made

Lat 37 39 Long 111 30 East

Remarks on Board Saturday 2nd Nov

First part Strong Breezes from N.W. and hail & squally
heading N.W. Middle part fine breezes from S.W. steering West
latter part Light winds and fine weather from S.W. heading West
with all sail out the Barclay in sight

Lat 36 57 Long 110 00 by Chron Lat by Dist 110 40

Remarks on Board Sunday 3rd Nov 1839

First part fine breezes from N.W. and fine weather heading
N.W. saw 4 or 5 finbacks middle the same heading N.W. by N latter
Light winds and calm heading N.W. employed smoking Ship at 7
Commenced with the Perimston tobacco Black pepper & Sugar No whals in
sight Lat 35 50

Remarks on Board Monday 4th Nov 1839

First light winds and fine weather from N.W. heading N.W.
saw 3 or 4 finbacks at 6 took of the hatches and found rats
dead in the cabin latter part Brisk Breezes from N.W.
heading N.W. at 9 A.M. spoke the Ship Stonington of New
London 511 tons 2 sail in sight Entered in Ship's duty

Lat 35 08 Long 118 20 East

Remarks on Board Tuesday 5th Nov

First part Strong breezes from West heading at N at dark
took in sail latter part the same wind S.W. at day Light
made and steered at N nothing in sight Lat 34 00 Long 120 50
