Chaled down middle light wind from N.W. Latter part light winds from N.W. at 8 P.M. commenced cutting at 9 P.M. finished at 10 P.M. Boiling Empt. Stowing down several finbacks in light

 First part light winds from West heading S.W. in company with the Bark Cape Codderon Nothing in sight Middle fine breeze from West heading S.W. Latter the same Nothing in sight Lat 37 05 Long 106 56 Employed Boiling

Remarks on Board Tuesday 10th Dec^r 1839
 First part light winds from West heading S.W. with a large swell from S.W. at 2 P.M. spoke the Ship Alexander Manafeto of Hudson with 6 whale Middle and Latter the same saw one finback and one sail Lat 37 47 Long 104 46 East

Remarks on Board Wednesday 11th Dec^r 1839
 First part fine breeze from West heading S.W. finished repairing the Boat and painted here one sail in light steering to the Eastward Middle and Latter the same Employed in Ship duty No one sail in sight Lat 37 05 Long 104 40 East

Remarks on Board Thursday 12th Dec^r
 First part light winds from West heading S.W. at 1 P.M. sent down the Main topsail to repair at 6 P.M. finished it and sent it aloft Nothing in sight Middle fine breeze Latter part Brisk Breezes from West heading S.W. Employed one sail in light Lat 38 05 South

Remarks on Board Friday 13th Dec^r 1839
 First part fresh gale from South and thick rainy weather at 2 took in sail heading E by S Middle the same Latter part fresh gale from S.W. heading S.E. Nothing in sight Lat 37 51 Long by Dist 112 25 By Chron 112 31 East

Remarks on Board Saturday 14th Dec^r
 First part fresh gale from S.W. and clear weather at 1 P.M. set the fore topsail double reefed and cept off E by S at dark took in the fore topsail Nothing in sight Middle fresh gale from West heading E by S at 1 P.M. sent to heading S.W. with the thick rainy weather Latter part fresh gale from West heading S.W. and rainy squally weather at 8 set double reefed top sails and cept off E by S one sail in sight but not the line of a whale Lat 38 11 Long 114 10 East

Remarks on Board Sunday 15th Dec^r
 First part fresh gale from West heading S.W. at dark took fore & Main topsails and sail in sight Middle fresh gale from S.W. heading S.E. and squally Latter the same at day light set the fore topsail and cept off E by S saw one carcass and one finback Lat 38 00 Long 116 23
