

Remarks on Board Friday 5th June
All this day light winds from S.E. and fine weather
a part of the crew ashore saw 1 or 2 whale outside

Remarks on Board Saturday 6th June
All this day Light winds & variable, a part of the crew
ashore got off a Boat Load of Wood saw 2 or 3 whale

Remarks on Board Sunday 7th June
This day Light winds from S.E. and cloudy weather
with thunders no whale in the Bay

Remarks on Board Monday 8th June
This day variable winds and weather with thunders
and lightning and rain got off 3 Boat Loads of
wood & saw 2 or 3 whale

Remarks on Board Tuesday 9th June
First Middle & Latter fine weather saw 2 or 3 whale
Employed Wooding &c &c

Remarks on Board Wednesday 10th June
All this day Light winds and fine weather at 8 one Boat
from the Martha and one from our Ship lowered for a whale
the Martha's Boat struck and got stuck also Boat killed both
the whale to sk & cut the hump back & cut it off

Remarks on Board Thursday 11th June
All this day rainy squally weather no whale in
the Bay

Remarks on Board Friday 12th June
This Strong Breeze squally weather at 8
Struck & killed a humpback at 8 P.M. Struck a right
whale and he run away with the 3 Boat of the
Martha whaling in company with the Martha took
the humpback to our Ship & cut him in 4 or 5

Remarks on Board Saturday 13th June
This day light winds and variable weather Struck &
killed a right whale & took the hump along
side of the Amazon and killed it

Remarks on Board Sunday 14th June 1840
All this day Light winds and fine weather at 5 commenced cutting at skin
rigs Capt. Whelding came aboard with a Boat crew to help cut
and sent 3 Boat from the ship a whaling at 8 Struck &
killed at 11 took the whale to the Ship Capt. Smith went aboard
to help cut the other whale 2 Boats from each Ship whaling
at 3 commenced Boiling

Remarks on Board Monday 15th June
All the day fine Breeze and fine weather Emp. Boiling
No whale in the Bay

Remarks on Board Tuesday 16th June
This day fine Breeze and fine weather at 10 lowered for
a whale Struck & killed at 11 took the hump to the Amazon
and cut there in 4 or 5 calf

Remarks on Board Wednesday 17th June
All this day Brisk Breeze from S.W. and fine weather
No whale in the Bay Emp. Boiling and Stowing
down

Remarks on Board Thursday 18th June 1840
All this Brisk Breeze and squally Emp. Boiling and Stowing
down at 11 all finished Boiling one Boat of whaling in company
with the Martha's Boat at 11 Struck and killed at 3 Struck
the whale about 8 miles from the ship it was a blowing
hard from S.W. and we did not see the Boat from the
Ship at dark the Boat got to the Ship so early allow-
ing hard from S.W. with thunders and lightning & rain

Remarks on Board Friday 19th June
First part fresh gale from S.W. Emp. Stowing
down Latter part Moderate at 1 P.M. went to see if we could
find the whale at Anchor but he was gone Anchor &
all a heavy swell setting in to the East Side of the Bay
from S.W. and we suppose that she went ashore

Remarks on Board Saturday 20th June
First part Brisk Breeze from S.W. the Boat of a looking
for whale saw 1 whale off shore Latter part Strong gale
from S.W. and rainy & weather
