Remarks on Board Saturday 11th July
All this day light wind from S.E. and a heavy swell setting
in to the Bay. No whale in sight.

Remarks on Board Sunday 12th July
All this day strong breeze East with a heavy swell heaving
in to the Bay with thick rainy weather at 8 o'clock
a cow & calf struck the calf and ran from deck and off
the water had back to them.

Remarks on Board Monday 13th July
This day light wind from S.E. and thick rainy weather
with a heavy swell from S.E. at 9 A.M. Toward for a
whale. No success. At 10 o'clock a cow & calf struck
killed a cow & calf at 5 took her to the Martha.

Remarks on Board Tuesday 14th July
All this day light wind and fine weather at 9 A.M. Toward
for a whale. No success. at 10 P.M. Toward again. No success.

Remarks on Board Wednesday 15th July
All this day fresh breeze and squally weather at 11
A.M. Toward for two whales. No success. Saw 1 whale
this day.

Remarks on Board Thursday 16th July
All this day light air and calm at 10 o'clock spore
a whale. No success. caught a large turtle.

Remarks on Board Friday 17th July
All this day light wind and fine weather here
up the Anchorage and chain got of a boat
load of wood took 3 men ashore that had a
light tuck of the Scurry, and built them
a house and left them ashore.

Remarks on Board Saturday 18th July
All this day light wind and fine weather at 10 P.M. Toward for
a humpback. Struck and killed at 10.30 took him
to the ship.

Remarks on Board Sunday 19th July
All this day Bristly Breeze from N and fine
weather at 9 commenced cutting at 9.30 finished
and commenced Boiling.

Ship's Haven at Fort St. Mary 1840

Remarks on Board Monday 20th July 1840
All this day heavy gale and rainy squally weather at 8 finished
Boiling. No whale in the Bay.

Remarks on Board Tuesday 21st July 1840
All this day light wind from S.W. and fine weather. After a part
of the oil was taken it cleared of the Martha. Employed Stowing down
oil to the saw, 2 whale of shore.

Remarks on Board Wednesday 22nd July
All this day light wind and fine weather from S.E. at 1.30 Toward
for a whale. Struck and killed. Took her to the ship
at 1.30. commenced cutting at 2.30 finished. and commenced
Boiling.

Remarks on Board Thursday 23rd July
All this day light wind from E.N.E. and fine weather at 9
Toward for a whale and chased with success. Employed Boiling
saw 2 whale.

Remarks on Board Friday 24th July
All this day light air and calm at 12 Toward for
two humpbacks. No success at 1.30 finished Boiling.

Remarks on Board Saturday 25th July 1840
All this day light wind and fine weather at 9 Toward for
a humpback. Struck and killed at 10.30 took her to the
Martha. Employed Stowing down.

Remarks on Board Sunday 26th July
All this day light wind and fine weather at 1 P.M. Toward
for a small right whale. Struck and killed at 2 took
her to the Martha. Saw hump back and chased with
success.

Remarks on Board Monday 27th July
All this day Bristly Breeze from S.W. and clear weather
No whale in sight. 5 or 6 men complaining with the swell
lays two or three of duty.

Remarks on Board Tuesday 28th July
This day fresh gale from W and squally weather
Toward for a humpback. No success.
