swell from S.E. Empty coaling Lings &c &c

Remarks on Board Wednesday 10th Sept
first part light winds and squally from S.W. Middle
light winds and fine weather at 4 A.M. got under
way and lay a back till 9 before we got the Anchor
on to the bows at 9 Capt. of S.S. in company with
the Martha up saw the Martha take a whale at 12
finished clearing the chain Slowed the Anchor and
unbent the chain &c &c & then down with the Scurry

Remarks on Board Friday 11th Sept
First part strong breeze from S.W. steering S.W.
at 4 Point Fowler's bore for compass at 10 P.M.
Sist 20 Miles from which I take my departure at
6 the Gale of S. Francis or Breakers bore S.W. & Sist
5 Miles Capt. of S.S. Middle strong breeze from
S.E. steering South latter part strong breeze from North
steering S.E. with thick rainy weather No ship

Remarks on Board Saturday 12th Sept
First part strong gale from S.W. and rain, squally
weather at 4 double reefed the topsails & first topgill
Main sail the Martha in sight Middle and latter
heavy gale from S.W. at 9 took in Mizzen
topsail and close reefed the Main & secured the
west Boat at 2 A.M. took in the fore topsail
at 4 luff to heading W.S.W. took the fore sail a
blowing heavy from S.W. Lat 35 29 Long 132 54 00

N to N.W. Nothing in sight Middle heavy
gale and variable from S. to S.W. and squally
latter more moderate at 9 set the fore sails
