 First part Moderate gale from S.W. at 1 o'clock
 of E.B. and set the fore topsail double reefed
 Middle Moderate gale from S.W. at 10 set double
 at 12 set whole topsail & full steering & Latter part
 fine breeze from N. steering E. Compa in Ship's duty
 Lat 35 42 Long 135 00

Remarks on Board Tuesday 5th Sept 1840
 First part fine breeze from N.W. at dark
 left to heading S.S.W. with the head yard
 a pack Middle light wind and variable at 8 o'clock
 Ship's heading E.B. at day light made sail
 heading E.B. Light wind from S.W. and fine weather
 Lat 35 50 Long 135 48

Remarks on Board Wednesday 6th Sept
 First part light wind from S.E. & E.
 heading S.E. & E. at 4 P.M. Langueo Island
 Bore the compass E. at dark the wind hauled
 E.S.E. double topsail & took in jib & mainsail
 heading S. Middle part variable wind and
 weather with lightning and rain at day light made
 sail at 7 p.m. double reefed topsail at 7 the rain was in
 sight but it came in thick rainy weather
 at 8 o'clock of S.S.E. with the at 10 put the
 Ship under close reefed main topsail & fore sail
 a blowing heavy from S.S.E. heading N.

Remarks on Board Thursday 7th Sept 1840
 First part strong gale from S heading N.W.
 Middle the same at 3 o'clock Ship's heading S.E.
 Latter more moderate at day light set double fore
 topsail the wind S.W. at 8 o'clock E.B. and shook the
 reef out of the main topsail & set jib & mainsail
 at 12 o'clock saw 2 right whale close to the ship
 could not lower for them on account of the
 sick 10 or 12 men of duty

Remarks on Board Friday 18th Sept 1840
 First part light wind from N. steering E.S.E.
 Middle and Latter Brisk breeze from E. steering to windward
 nothing in sight Most all hands complaining with the scurvy
 and we have had a head wind most of the time since we
 have been out of the Bay and good only now when
 we shall get in to port for good

Lat 36 34 Long 136 08 East

Remarks on Board Saturday 19th Sept 1840
 First part light wind and fine weather from E.S.E. heading
 South Middle and Latter light wind and fine weather from
 E.S.E. saw 1 right whale & one humpback & 1 sperm whale but
 we have not got but 10 or 12 men that is fit to go in a boat it
 is hard times and a head wind Lat 36 45 Long 136 10 East

Remarks on Board Sunday 20th Sept 1840
 First part light wind and fine weather heading S.E. at 3 P.M.
 Latter Ship's heading South Middle and Latter the same light wind
 from E.S.E. and fine weather Lat 36 54 Long 136 09 East

Remarks on Board Monday 21st Sept 1840
 First part light wind and fine weather from E.S.E. sent
 the main top gallant yard a lift and set the sail Middle and
 Latter light air and calm No C.B. this day

Remarks on Board Tuesday 22nd Sept 1840
 First part light air and calm at 2 o'clock saw 1 sperm whale mustered
 all hands and had a puff to Mammot Boat by taking one that
 had the scurvy lower & chased to success 10 men that
 is very bad with the scurvy & 5 or 6 more that is
 complaining Middle light air from N.W. steering E.B. & E.
 Latter part fine breeze from N. steering E.B. & E.
 Lat 37 01 Long 136 13

Remarks on Board Wednesday 23rd Sept 1840
 First part Brisk breeze from N. steering E.B. & E. per
 saw a plenty of sperm whale but could not lower for
 them on account of the sick all saw whale and to row to
 to them as far as you could see two right a long side
