 Employed sitting up Shocks & one watch a Shore one
 Liberty Henry August refused to do duty put him
 in Irons and put him in to the river at dark sent a
 Boat for the Liberty Men and all of them came of
 but George E. Coleridge and ~~themselves~~ not com of
 Left him a Shore tolerably Drunk and he is the
 first Man that has Stopped a Shore with the out leave
 Bro't of 3 Sacks of potatoes and one turnip and cabbage &c

Remarks on Board Sunday 7th Oct
 All this day fine breeze from S.W. and fine weather
 one watch a Shore one Liberty all came of but
 James Simmonds & John Cason and Mr
 Coleridge came of as Drunk as a Lord after
 3 days and one night a Shore at 6 P.M. Let
 Henry August out of Irons and his promise to
 Obey Orders and do Duty &c Sold to the Schooner
 Victory of Adelaide by 100 lbs tobacco

Remarks on Board Monday 8th Oct
 All this day fine breeze from East and fine
 weather Employed getting of a raft of water and healing
 and scraping Ships &c at 11 A.M. the Ship Julian of
 New Bedford came in to Anchor Capt. Hays 1100
 Bbls Oil 400 of it &c

Remarks on Board Tuesday 9th Oct 1840
 All this day fine breeze and variable Employed painting
 Ships & sitting up Shocks at 10 P.M. Capt Smith and
 Capt Hays started for Adelaide in a Boat fore
 to get ~~repacked~~ &c &c

Remarks on Board Wednesday 10th Oct 1840
 All this day fine breeze from S to S.E. and fine weather
 Employed scraping and painting Ships &c one watch a Shore
 one Liberty Bro't of 1 Sack of potatoes and one Sheep

Remarks on Board Thursday 11th Oct 1840
 All this day fresh breeze from the Westward and raining
 squally weather Employed stowing down water &c one watch
 a Shore one Liberty

Remarks on Board Friday 12th Oct
 All this strong breeze from the Westward Employed
 in Ships duty and sent a raft of Casks a Shore and fix
 a part of them 3 Men Alseonda Williams Gannett and
 James Simmonds

Remarks on Board Saturday 13th Oct 1840
 All this day brisk breeze from North Employed working
 &c &c

Remarks on Board Sunday 14th Oct 1840
 All this day fine breeze from S.E. and fine weather
 one watch a Shore one Liberty

Remarks on Board Monday 15th Oct
 All this day fine breeze and fine weather Employed
 in Ships duty &c Bro't of 150 lbs potatoes from Shore
 and half a Sheep &c

Remarks on Board Tuesday 16th
 All this day fine breeze and fine weather got of a
 raft of water and stowed it away &c Sold 240 lbs of Old
 Bread and 174 lbs Corn
