Remarks on Board Sunday 1st Nov 1840
All this day Breeze and fine weather from S.E.
one watch a shore and Liberty This beats hell right
out and out 38 days in port and Capt Smith and Mr Holmes
at Adelaide and go only now when he will come for
don't and if I was in Old Vermont he might stay till
the resurrection of the Jews for all what I care

First part Strong Breeze from E and fine latter
Strong Breeze from S.E. one watch a shore and
Liberty at dark Mr Holmes & Mr Coale arrived
from Adelaide with the Barge from Capt Smith's

at 4 the Boat arrived from Adelaide late to Liverpool
457 lbs Biscuit and 460 lbs Corn 1 Bottle Beef one watch a

J & L Cohen J Melville W B Dwight Stopped with but leave

Remarks on Board Wednesday 4th Nov 1840
All this day Strong Breeze S.E. and fine weather at 9
A.M. the Julian got under way and went to sea at dark
Sent a Boat for the Men W B Dwight came of at
at 4 J L Cohen & Melville came of in a shore Boat

Remarks on Board Thursday 5th Nov 1840
First part fresh breeze from S.E. and fine weather
Middle the same latter Strong Breeze from S.E. at sun
rise took our Anchor and proceeded to sea by way of Investigator
Strait Stowed the Anchors &c

Remarks on Board Friday 6th Nov 1840
First part Strong Breeze from S.E. Steering N.E. W.
unbent the chains & stowed them below at dark the Langa
roo Island Bore the S.W. End Ende S.E. Dist 10 Miles
Steering S.W. by S. Sent George J. Cohen out of the
cabin in to the Steerage to live and do his duty as
Boat Stewer for his Drunken worthless conduct
Middle fresh gale from E.S.E. at dark the Breeze
the topsail & look in the Jib at 12 took in
Main Sail & fore top sail and left to heading
S latter part Strong Breeze and fine weather Steering
west Lat 36. 14 Long 136 17

Steering W at dark took in Sail saw 2 fin backs & 1 whale
Ship 4 Men Joseph Perry Charles & Henry

the Breeze from S.W. Lat 36 30 Long 136 11
