 First part Strong gales from West and variable
 Nothing in sight Latter part Light wind
 from West fine weather at day light Made
 Sail nothing in sight Lat 41 N Long 121 30

Remarks on Board Monday 14th Decr 1840
 First part light wind and fine weather from
 S.W. Nothing in sight at dark took in sail & covered
 fore back in light Latter part fine breeze from S.W.
 and thick foggy weather

Remarks on Board Tuesday 15th
 First part fine breeze from S.W. and variable
 weather nothing in sight at dark Made sail at dark & took
 reefed topsail and wore ship's heading S.E. Latter
 part Brisk breeze from S.W. heading N at day
 Light set whole topsails & hauled in sail. Thick
 foggy weather saw a great number of Finbacks in
 sight Lat 41 52 Long 120 56

Remarks on Board Wednesday 16th
 First part thick foggy weather at 4 it lighted up
 saw 2 bright whale Leeward and struck them
 both the line got foul and we was forced to
 cut from one of them and he went off killed the
 other at 4 we took the whale to the ship took in
 sail & took a great number of whale in sight and
 2 sail Middle part light gale S.W. at 3 the
 after chain parted but when we took the whale
 to the ship we bent a tow line to the head rope
 in case it should part haul the whale along side
 put on another chain at day light commenced cutting
 very niggardly took 1 lip throat & head at 8 finished
 nothing and commenced boiling No whale in sight
 saw one sail Lat 42 12 Long 120 32

Remarks on Board Thursday 18th Decr 1840
 First part strong breeze from S.W. heading S.E. at
 dark took in sail saw 2 whale and 2 sail Middle and
 Latter part gale from S.W. at 11 By 1 and thick haze
 weather nothing in sight Employed boiling & to Cab

Remarks on Board Friday 19th Decr 1840
 First part Moderate gale from S.W. at 11 By 1 and thick
 weather at 4 P.M. finished boiling Latter part strong
 gale from S.W. at day light Close reefed main topsail and
 took fore sail and commenced coopersing and tarring a
 way the Sturidge and Storing Beluist Deck & to
 at 11 spoke the ship Mancey of Harver Lat 41 52

Remarks on Board Saturday 19th
 First part strong gale from S.W. Employed Bundling
 Bone Storing it at dark More Moderate set the
 fore sail 2 sail in sight Latter part Brisk breeze
 from S.W. at day light Made sail heading North
 Employed setting up sheets and fitting rope trapes
 to the Main yard found the gun one to be broke
 5 sail in sight but no whale
 Lat 41 12 Long 120 34

Remarks on Board Sunday 20th Decr 1840
 First part strong breeze from S.W. heading
 S.W. Nothing in sight Latter part strong breeze and
 thick foggy rainy weather nothing in sight

Remarks on Board Monday 21st
 First part fine breeze from West at 11 it cleared
 up Made sail heading S.W. at 4 we lower fore
 a whale struck and at 5 we took the whale
 commenced cutting at 6 we took in sail for
 whale in sight Latter part light air and calm
 from N at day light Made sail and commenced boiling
 at 9 lower fore a whale that was going South to
 S.W. No success Employed setting up sheets & to
