

Thursday Dec 18 1848

The sack mending sail sent down for
to I think that the crew has died away some
of them. I hope they will be able to
any consequence washed of the work in the
sacking. They were sick have
regained their health now.

Friday Dec 19 1848 Lat 19.15 Long 178.30

Cut up an over the sail made a 1/2 sail
of it had to go on then again this light
not much wind washed of this morning the
sack to work some a sailing broke out for
sheet.

Saturday Dec 20 1848 Long 179.40

To work on the sail but it being a
very good fit we being now in lat. Longitude may
or having now crossed the meridian we are now obliged
to call the next day Monday taking Sunday day.

Sunday Dec 21 1848

The sack making spun again and the likes in
the back and for some that was all have got
a good breeze a little water by spinning. We
raised the main sail, hauled down the sheet
the weather one full.

Thursday Dec 18 1848

Broke out for water to work in the rigging
mending the top a strong breeze
was blowing. I washed of the sack
sacking. I sent in the job repaired
it and sent it again.

Friday Dec 19 1848

Cleaned the top work to the kitchen so
that it might work easier and two or three
light signals found the main sail washed
of backing on sheet out and cooping it
putting on iron hoops in place of wood ones
the more still, shall go on a large school
of Porpoise. I saw 1/2.

Thursday Dec 20 1848

Broke out the Pinks and the Cotton Cloth
to look at it and save out the different sort
for sample give us some of the Pinks which
is a great luxury to us. Stuck a Porpoise lost
him. Though the ship going to fast to save
him washed of setting up to Bell Shrouds.

Friday Dec 21 1848 Long 168.10

Nothing particular going on some of the hands
are mending great. Unloads an other boxes from
Hoops. Spinning the fine of Ropes
and the likes to take with the natives
of Suram others clearing clothes for trade.
