sight of it took a trip for Laid this
morning. Sheek reefed but loose strain to
fall when I jumped ship. across from that
in the best 24 hours. she had looked over
1400 strokes squared in the yard. Laid
yet 17 miles land one point on the
bow looks quite high but cannot tell
for certain yet. Laid with a distance from
us and cloudy did not wash of the snow
in as customary rose a bit ahead of us
we gain on the land fast in several places
in sight. Right off. Baspan another

will have to up here and up cables and clear
away everything up in chest of the main island
hauled back the main rig. The Capt went
ashore in the Mast Boat to see if there was
a chance of getting a vessel here in about two
hours, in the Boat with her signal set for
us to come in. Laid up. stood in. then was
a Spanish came off with him. there is a
strong wind dead ahead and engaged so that
two more than we gain still making
short tacks the each but holes just got turned
in when they were poised out to help get in
as the wind had shifted in close in to the

Land the wind died away and left us to the
mercy of the current. which was rather fast. then
a thick mist a little land here & there up
and the stood out till the snow broke. By 10
P.M. Laid up. fell sail, making short tacks.
there is land on all sides of us keep a sharp
look out have got well to the windward of
the island where we intend to go as for their
appearance this for me is one of the first best
examples that ever I saw excepting the Persian
Boys to look at the green & blue. then at
the brown. then to their villages but
more than that looked at their filthy covered
with the most abundance of dogs. this is
a fine sight to the eye of Laid that has been
since the Persian of seeing slay. it is a
kind of gladness thought that Laid for me
in hopes to get some potatoes. Laid Hoge
Cannon and various other commodities to move
I must chop any Laid for I expect to hear
them sing out stays every moment. at 8 o'clock
when we turned out found that we were
singing. the land was got breakfast. then
at 10 o'clock to go on deck. stood in to the
Bay the wind died away and we moved her
in within a quarter of a mile of the shore
