

Sheep what Corn there was it being on the Cab
when he purchased it making a Hen Coop to put
the Hens in for fear that they will go overboard
Called the Bulbee Sailing with the Warren not
much of a breeze though it freshened after sun set
tacked several times during the night took in
the Light sails it looks some like a gale
of wind the wind shifting from one point to
another throws water some rapid top sails
bleeding C & C tacked heaving at washed of
Tumbled ship then was but a few strokes
shook out reef the Warren is close to us, doing
as we do the wind increases tacked ship

Sunday Feb 11th 1849

Called down the men from Loft begin to see
plenty of Birds around us tacked ship again as
well as double reefed the top sails the Warren
close to our stern the wind died away some
shook the reef out of the main top sail and
fore steering at a heading so the wind died away
shook reef out of top sails set main top sail
washed of broke out for paper fitting over running
reefs got up the steps for them that wanted
Some of them sleep rather hard on it further
main top sail the Warren doing every thing
that we do

Sunday Feb 12th Lat 29. 42 N

Took one reef in fore top sail on account of its
being ripped the Warren doing the same had
a shot of 10 inch for 4 inch for
top sails. Places find that ship much different
from that in port this there is no unnecessary
work but then it is work from Charn till night
and that there is no need of C & C sent on board
again heading N & C tacked ship the doing the
same good there there is some water here a good
reason now find that it begins to grow some cool
the C & C takes some of going to forward of
the wind permit the Warren intending to do
the same steering C & C made sail, Tumbled ship
got up sail, worked on that day a school of Boy Fish
in back saw some small islands on our bow

Tuesday Feb 13

Sailing with the Warren we killed a dog this day
pulled top sail sails the 10th C & C came on board double
reefed top sails fore and aft steering course C & C
light wind think their reason for taking in sail at
night must be through fear of Land it seems not
correct on the whole pleasant weather on deck
some of a sea on coming to the wind we have had lately
nearly a calm washed of shook reef out of top sails
hooked top sail fore and aft the Warren stood
sails fore and aft we bent in main top sail
