Thursday Bar 23rd

A light wind the fog cleared up a little
still light and thick but it is getting better
after being for a month nothing to be seen
excepting the guide steering at 1000 ft.
Can't had some rain wind died away
fog thicker than ever.

Friday Bar 24th

Thick weather strong wind took in dead
standing boats Barre half a gale of wind
made sail at day light ships in sight
there came a squall cleared up then the

Sail sail but for and storm top sail Barre
sail fore and aft saying to under close
sail rain top sail after minutes from
the time it struck.

Saturday Bar 25th

Standing Linea Tackel blowing strong
one ship in sight laying to starboard
Boats crew this made sail at day light
not much wind run down and spoke the
ship which proved to be the Trident of
New Bedford. The second boat was Trimethy
Davis then have got 1000 ft. no

Sunday Bar 26th

Fanning all day had some snow from ship
in sight this night took in sail went on
board our own ship very near a calm as for
Ducks Pigeons and other shore birds there
is plenty of them to be seen every day
but no Whales nor nothing else much.
Sail at day light washed of Boats and for Key
Point 80 fanning with the Trident saw one Whale
the boats closed after him but he was going to
fast.

Monday Bar 26th

Not much rain today rain this day too
ships in sight one standing this very little
a light breeze it proved to be the
