Tuesday June 27th

in tow at 6 o'clock Fog cleared up in two Whales
in sight the first and second took second
hear them blowing quite distinctly the fog
had set in again not much wind. Heading NW
made but some fog in the first part of the
day tacked ship ship in sight did not see
any thing of any consequence

Thursday March 29th

See, I have called them Pump Back, took
and heading W. N. took in sail the wind
freshening up some Egg setting in the Boats
Auss standing about three hours each
the Wheel turned & the all hands made
sail several ships in sight spoke ship
Cherbourg from Bremen

Thursday June 29th

No Whales in sight - saw one ship trying
and attacked ship several times took in
sail. Thumped ship washed of a fine sight

This Hearing of S. W. called all hands under
 Sail tacked Ship one Ship in sight see
 11 mile lovers for them and except 1 mile
 out for each plenty of Fish in sight
 strong breeze a choppy sea on
 Friday June 20th

Friday March 30th

Several were in success plenty of them
in sight the Capt is sick so that he could
not come on deck backed ship away
Whales in sight took in sail lashed the
wheel think the Capt has got better
called all hands made fast three ships in sight
the Boats were after whales plenty of whales you
can see them any way that you are disposed to look
but they are wild some of them are large others
small the ships are heaving before the
wind close hauled and laying to

Saturday Mar 9th

Boaty along but can not get any yet and the other ships that are in sight have as better luck but in last fine night strong breeze not quite so cold as it has been latter all hands made sail had some rain steering to the westward ships in sight too boating

Sunday Aug 24th

Sailing with the William Thompson of New Bedford
 2000 sq. spouts but got a distemper
 took in sail standing wheel this slightly
 running before the wind. We had a shift of
 wind bore her two on the Lopez tack made sail
 back out for Home strong here our ship in sight
