makes things creek under the fore and main top
sails and fore sail put the boats on the upper
crosses hauls out the main spencer sheet
reefed main top sail lashed the wheel it shog
got now to be a gale of wind and a hard one clear
not a cloud to be seen and the wind still rises

Put on preventive Baskets put on more lashings
on the Boats iced the Boats under cracked
Ice Boat took her in an aback and all
fast fore and aft standing quarter Wches
Heeding off May the 22nd above took at 12th O'clock
at Boats crew think the wind does not increase
as if did there is a bad fog on here it is a short
chopping sea but the ship lays two fires off
occasionally shipping a sea abt 6. Snow blown not
so much wind a longer sea wave ship looked over
board and surmount the sail close reefed

Tuesday Apr. 9th Lat. 98. 05-

The wind going down not much of here no ships
in sight the sea is a subsiding stand yesterday
day time Boat crews sight them Proceeding at 6 o'clock
but could not much of a see then is about three
hans to a sea to over our little the days get shorter

called all hands made sail three ships in sight
two standing they were greatly a coter spoke could feared
to be the enemy. The boats were the other
was the captain of Stockholm ship was the second.
Thursing all day a man fell overboard this day but did
not injure him much. Makes in sight but going
fast. Wednesday July 18th

Wednesday July 18th
at 10 AM on one of the ships got lost this day
but the Whaler made his escape from them
Whales in sight but at a distance not much wind
took in Capt. Boatswain's ship all hands
at day light - anchor sail in Whales however for then
did not fasten for the Whales were the least caught
to make one ship in sight - killing it.

Thursday Aug 5th Lat 98.90

Thursday Apr. 5th Lat. 28.30
 Covered again but did nothing and the other ships
 no better. The Packet took his old post again not
 taking his mail on a chad came took in sail a
 pleasant sight this and so far the day much
 sail was seen of several ships in sight some of
 them a Whaling Friday Apr. 6th Lat. 29.05
 Fine weather nothing doing phos in sight but
 a clipper took in sail good weather all
 hands at day light much sail Packet for
 Nelson Bay no Whales in sight this day

Saturday, 7th
Whales loved for them but our luck this
times in sight one of them running down the
break in Spanish Ship Run Whales this season
took in sail the Capt. Panning late at night
made sail at day light nearly a calm sea a whale
