

Wednesday May 30th

Not a whale to be seen. The Capt talks some of going in to the Okotuk Sec if we do not see whales soon and we can get a fair wind to sail at. The weather thick heavy & calm no wind. Thick fog & day light - staid water looked a breeze blowing up made sail with clear one ship in sight. Sailing with her the Bears of St. Lawrence this season we are rigging up the staid Bount Land plain in sight distant 45 miles.

Thursday May 31st Lat 82.08

Boats down the rest of the day starting at the whales hunting and waiting on to form, choprant. Sunday June 1st for any part of the thick there whales are so close as them that we have been chasing the best then on the whales all around us. There is four ships in sight in there took in sail one ship. Capt came on board and took up the Boat Steering. At 11 o'clock all hands at six o'clock thick fog & pump for ship. The fog still continued showers of rain.

Friday June 1st

Plenty of rain we are laying with our main top sail to the mast. The fog light up for a few moments and a ship took in fore and main top sail and set the back had a Thimble. There several showers of rain heading S.W. thick fog staid quarter. Whales bore ship nothing doing heard whales blowing around us.

Saturday June 2nd

Fog as thick as tar have to feel your way as you along with the less night of wind nothing but fog. Set Boat Oars back a little and heading S.W.

All hands at Breakfast thick fog can hear whales blowing all around us dead calm. There has been plenty of sharks around.

Sunday June 2nd making land

The fog light up for a few moments see whales clear boats but the fog came on again thick as ever which made them come of board see plenty of seals every day the Capt shot one or banded him with a belt in the neck but they could not get him. Although they looked for him just after he was clear, cleared off for a few moments could see land plain as well as whales. Fog set in as thick as ever calling all hands at 8 o'clock to get their breakfast. Thick fog & broke out for better. Breakfast and the fog lit up a little and a ship took in sail and we saw her. Right whales but for a short time the fog as thick as ever a rain at the wheel steering N.E.

Sunday June 4th

The Capt and party trying their skill at shooting men with their guns shooting balls the first thing was a poor seal but she escaped with a whole. Heide and then at 10 o'clock on the end of the staid sail Bount and clear. What the Capt came off victorious then they tried with Pistols the Capt had been shot after that shot at Birds but only scared them. Fog lit up a little and a ship showed in and we for her. Fog set in again got out the old ship gun and fired that time the ship answered us so close to board her. Capt came on board after going there kept the ship close together nearly a calm plenty of whales in hearing their haw land in sight for a few moments.
