

going home the water is full of scum and so forth
took in Main top Gell sail furl'd Main sail steering NNE
Gard's square cutted the back made main and main top Gell sails
fly ab and main sail scraped decks see Hump Backs a good
where steering NNE of the ship to be had some rain

Sunday July 8th

Took in fly jib and Main top Gell sail strong wind
rather hazy at times squared in yards steering NNE by E see Land
on Starboard Beam to the Loabard Bow very low land braced round
the yards furl'd Main top Gell sail Braced up courses Capt
intends going in tomorrow to see what he can see a decided
thick fog been there all around sparkling can hear a number
noise sounds like Breckers no wind the ship drifts clear round
not a breath of air plenty of Hump Backs and Fin Backs that
come close to the ship thick fog there is much drift wood
so picked up a large log think it was a log

Monday July 9th

Thick fog all day around occasionally very hazy
see several large seals here at 2 AM fog cleared up a little see
Land distant 12 miles as near as we could judge there was
cliffs on the top of the high points and in the Ravine there
appears to be a large Bay in here if we could get a little
wind the Capt would look and see if there was Whales in here
there is a strong current here a very light breeze steering NNE
just as the wind and sun set in again thick fog all
square in the yards

Tuesday July 10th

At 12 came to anchor there was two tides met and at

far as you could see there was a line of foam see several Hump
at and then they stopped in between the two currents took in
fly jib and top Gell sail braced up courses and Spunker had some
Gard's aback at 10 Midnight hauled down jib some rain
it still holds foggy in thing being so near NNE and S

Wednesday July 11th Lat 58.40

Sounded found 60 Fathoms of water saw 20 again
at 9 PM found that it had shoaled 10 Fathoms thick fog cleared
down tacks close to the wind broke out for better tacked ship
twice in the night made all sail on her Land ahead
and on each bow see a Whale Breaching RAM on the weather
Quarter a good breeze the Land is a long bay of can not
see Lanes as yet. Our Lick then have made their ap-
pearance on deck have gone to work with the rest so I
think they will go it over find very cold here altho-
ugh the wind is from the South. The fog cleared up a
little Land ahead see a Whale of some size Breaching
a light breeze square yards steering for a Gulf there
is here quite clear sounded twice 13 Fms first time and
12 the next sandy bottom could see a Brig in shore at
Anchor having not far from the town of Chock tacked ship
steering close to the wind heading NNE

Thursday July 12th Lat 58.40 Long 155.37

A great number of seal around but they are
older here than at sea set in foggy again but did not
hold so long have not seen a Spout this day heading
NNE by South
