one sail in sight sail set mid part fresh breeze from S.E.

24 hours lat 19° 17' N long 120° 04' West

the 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from

big Solan mid part fine weather wind

sail set sound there lat 19° 55' N long 111° 36' W

at 1/2 past 7 A.M. saw St. Antonio bearing
W. by N dist 15 miles lent the Chaner bound to
St Vincent sound there

come to anchor in St Vincent Bay. Decree
went on shore and got one raft water mid
part fine weather lying in St Vincent in company
with barque President westport and big Solan
Siffycan latter part fine weather lying at anchor

first part of the 24 hours begins with fine
weather steering South by West all drawing
sail set mid part the same fresh breeze
and rary at 1/2 past 5 A.M. saw Brava bearing
S. dist 13 miles latter part wind from Southward
heading westward sound there lat 14° 48' N

Remarks Friday September 1st
first part of the 24 hours begins with fresh
breeze from S.E. and rary heading S.W. mid
part fresh gales and rain squalls wind
from Southward latter part saw black fish
board 3 boats caught one to the barbed
boat and took him along side lat 14° 40' N long 126° 11' W
sound there

Remarks Saturday Sept 2nd
first part of the 24 hours begins with
light wind from S.E. heading to the N and E
mid part steering S.E. by E wind from N and E
and blowing latter part light from S.W. by W
heading S.E. all drawing sail set sound there
24 hours lat 15° 58' N long 128° 38' West

Remarks Sunday Sept 3rd
first part of the 24 hours begins with fine
weather steering S.E. by E all drawing sail set
wind from S.W. by W mid part fine weather
latter part the same steering S.E. by E
sound there 24 hours lat 16° 11' N long 129° 29' West
