Remarks Sunday Oct 10th
first part of these 24 hours begins with fine breeze from N^W steering S^W all tacking sail but mid the same latter part fresh breeze and rancy sound these 24 hours

Remarks Monday Oct 11th
first part of these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from N^W steering S^W at 2 P.M. took in fore and main topgallantails at 4 P.M. bore to under mast reef topgail heading S^W winds at S^E sent down fore topgallant yards mid latter more moderate but double reef topgails and waves heading S^W sound lat 53° 54' long 41° 14'

Remarks Thursday Oct 12th
first part of these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from S^E heading S^W S under short sail on bent the sail and mend it and bent it again mid moderate heading to the south latter the same sound these 24 hours lat 54° 36' long 40° 50'

Remarks Friday Oct 13th
first part of these 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from N^W steering S^E mid the same at 6 P.M. took in waist boat bore to heading to the N^W at 9 P.M. wear ships to the bottom and set fore topgail sound these 24 hours lat 56° 07' long 40° 59'

Remarks Saturday Oct 14th
first part of these 24 hours begins with strong breeze from N^W heading N^W at 3 P.M. bore to heading to the westward fresh gales and rancy mid the same latter part lying to under mast reef main topgail and fore spencer heading S^W sound these 24 hours lat 56° 21' long 40° 41'

Remarks Sunday Oct 15th
first part of these 24 hours begins with strong gales from N^W lying to heading S^W mid part more moderate latter part fine weather cruising for night whales and end these 24 hours lat 56° 15' long 39° 58'

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Remarks Monday Oct 16th
first part of these 24 hours begins with fine weather cruising for night whales at sundown took in sail for the night latter part fine weather cruising for whales sound these 24 hours lat 56° 54' long 41° 26'

Remarks Sunday Oct 17th
first part of these 24 hours begins with fine weather at 4 P.M. saw whale supposed them to be night whale board & boats did not get any there came on board and took in sail for the night mid fresh breeze at 6 P.M. bore to heading S^E winds E^NE and rancy sound these 24 hours

first part of these 24 hours begins with fresh gales and rancy lying to with blast reef mantel and fore spencer winds E^NE mid part the same latter part strong gales from the West lying to sound these 24 hours lat 57° 05' long 40° 50'

first part of these 24 hours begins with fresh gales from West lying to under mast reef main topgail and fore spencer mid part the same latter part fresh gales from N^W lying to sound these 24 hours lat 56° 18' long 40° 40'

first part of these 24 hours begins with fine weather set fore topgail and foresail and sail heading to the S Eastward at sundown took in sail mid latter fine weather sound these 24 hours lat 56° 45' long 40° 28'

first part of these 24 hours begins with fine weather at 2 P.M. saw night whales board & boats brought more at sundown took in sail for the night latter part strong breeze from the N steering West sound these 24 hours lat 56° 44' long 41° 44'
