Remarks Saturday May 11th  
this 24 hours begins with light winds  
and variable heading to the N E at sundown  
took in sail for the night latter  
part steering N E light winds from S E  
Sound lat 31° 00' N long 78° 12' W

one sail in sight

Remarks Sunday May 12th  
this 24 hours begins with light winds from  
S E steering on the wind to the N  
at sundown took in sail for the night  
Mid part steering E latter part steering  
N E Sound this day lat 31° 14' N long 77° 01' W

Saw blackfish  
board caught none

Remarks Monday May 13th  
first part of this 24 hours begins with  
fresh breeze from S W steering S E  
at 6 P.M. took in sail for the night  
fresh gales and rugged latter part  
the same sound this day

one sail in sight

Remarks Tuesday May 14th  
this 24 hours begins with rugged weather  
winds from N N E at sundown took  
in sail for the night more moderate  
latter part fine weather heading S E  
winds from S W Sound lat 31° 45' N long 76° 27' W

Remarks Wednesday May 15th  
this 24 hours begins with fine weather  
wind from N W heading N E at sundown  
took in sail for the night latter  
part equally Sound lat 32° 40' N long 75° 41'

Remarks Thursday May 16th  
this 24 hours begins fine weather winds  
from the Eastward heading to the North  
in sail for the night latter part wind from the S W heading  
N E Sound lat 35° 16' N

at sundown took  
in sail for the night

this 24 hours begins with fine weather  
winds from S W steering N E at  
sundown took in sail for the night heading  
S E latter part the same fresh breeze  
and rugged on the foretopail and  
bommet mending it Sound lat 34° 14' N long 73° 02'

Remarks Saturday May 18th  
this 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from  
S W and rugged steering E finish  
sail and bent it at sundown shorten  
sail for the night latter part fresh breeze  
dent down maintopgallant sail to mend board  
this day lat 34° 16' N

Saw a ship steering  
E by N

Remarks Sunday May 19th  
this 24 hours begins with fresh breeze  
from S W and rugged finish mending  
maintopgallant sail and bent it at sundown  
short end sail for the night heading E by S  
latter part fairer heading E by S Sound  
this day lat 34° 16' N

one sail in sight

Remarks Monday May 20th  
this 24 hours begins with blowy weather  
winds from N E at sundown took in  
sail for the night heading N latter part  
heading E by N wind from S E and thick  
weather Sound this day lat none

Remarks Tuesday May 21st  
this 24 hours begins with fresh breeze from  
S E and thick weather heading to the Eastward  
under double reefed topails Mid part more  
moderate at 4 P.M. saw blackfish  
board 1 lb got fast and drew home on board  
steering E by S Sound lat 34° 16' N

Remarks Wednesday May 22nd  
this 24 hours begins with fine weather steering  
E by S implied in getting W by S at sundown  
shorten sail for the night wind from S W  
latter part fine weather steering E by S  
Sound lat 34° 41' N long 64° W

1 sail in sight
