Remarks on board Thursday December the 30<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with a light breeze from north west set all sail men employed in ordinary ship's duties latitude 30.22 longitude at four o'clock made away from the light sails and the masts run down continue down the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Friday December the 31<sup>st</sup> 1858

This day commenced with fine weather but soon at eleven o'clock got a light breeze from west south west and fresh men employed in ordinary ship's duties steady with south east and all sail four part of the night light breeze latter part strong breeze and rainy weather at four o'clock reaft the foretop sail and took in the masts so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday January the 1<sup>st</sup> 1859

This day commenced with a slight breeze and rainy weather at eight o'clock took in the mainmast and jib continue squally and a strong breeze from north south west threw the day steady south south east at six o'clock the wind shifted round north west and continue to blow strong throw the night with thick and rainy weather so ends this day

Remarks on board Sunday January the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north west and pleasant weather at the real shot of the foretop sail latitude 27.34 longitude 31.25 steady south east by south throw the day and night with a strong breeze and pleasant weather so ends this day

Remarks on board Monday January the 3<sup>rd</sup> 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze and fine weather at the mainmast and jib men employed breaking out for water got three about ten o'clock and started down again latitude 26.24 longitude 29.25 at four o'clock began to rain on shore and equally with steady south east by south at eleven o'clock took in the mainmast and jib at one o'clock took in the foresail and foretop sail and kept to the wire to the southern block a part throw the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 4<sup>th</sup> 1859

This day commenced with a morning squall from north west and clear weather latter latitude 24.59 longitude 25.11 at five o'clock hoist the foresail and foretop sail and kept off south east by south with a strong breeze and a heavy sea running continue to blow strong throw the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 5<sup>th</sup> 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north west turned the reef out of the foretop sail at eight o'clock hoisted a foresail men employed breaking out this forenoon got three and made back at twelve o'clock latitude 23.50 longitude 26.09 saw two ships steering to the westward by the wind had it equally throw the night at one o'clock reaft the foretop sail had heavy showers of rain

Remarks on board Thursday January the 6<sup>th</sup> 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from north west and rugged with sea for hours nothing going on south remark turned the reef out of the foretop sail latitude 22.10 longitude 28.36 steady south east by south throw the day with a strong breeze
