Remarks on board Dry day January the 7th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze and pleasant
weather men employed in getting the eating straps
about and splicing them round the mast head
saw a ship starting south latitude 21.02 longitude 11.06
this afternoon set the mainsail and jib got the
gauge blocks about stowed south east by south thru
the day had a light breeze and pleasant weather
thru the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday January the 8th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from
the south west and fine weather went up the
foremast and rigged it this forenoon
latitude 19.45 longitude 20.42 this afternoon
sent up the fore topgallant yard fine weather
but rain let the jib and mainsail
run down at six o'clock set boat crew watches
headed to the southward thru the night with
light air so ends

Remarks on board Sunday January the 9th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
north east and pleasant weather saw blackbird
but did not hoist the jib and mainsail
latitude 15.48 longitude 19.53 this afternoon brewed
up strong stowed south by east thru the
day at sundown took in sail and luff
to the wind headed south east thru the
night so with a strong breeze so ends
this day

Remarks on board Monday January the 10th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from
north east turned the reef out of the fore topgallant
and kept off before the wind cleared south
west men employed breaking out for
water and flour latitude 17.19 longitude 19.40
at four o'clock raised breeches ahead hoisted
them fore and aft at sundown reefed the fore topgallant
and kept to the wind to the eastward at twelve
o'clock were round to the westward had a finer
breeze and good weather thru the night so
ends this day

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 11th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
north east and pleasant weather men employed
setting up rigging saw porpoise latitude 15.59
longitude 19.44 stowed south west thru the day
and with south west thru the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 12th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from
the eastward set the mainsail and jib and
staysails hauled the eating gear on deck and over
hauled it and stowed in hold again latitude
13.42 longitude 19.48 stowed south by west thru
the day and night so ends this day

Remarks on board Thursday January the 13th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward
and thick smoky weather at five o'clock saw black fish
but did not hoist any sails up the foremast
at four o'clock saw blackfish and herd but did not
get any stowed south by east thru the day under all
sail at sundown took in the light sails latitude 11.50
no longer had a good weather thru the night so
ends this day
