Remarks on board Friday January the 21st 1859

This day commenset with a light breeze from north east and pleasant weather were round and made sail men employed working on rigging this forenoon hauled out long haul 22.44 this afternoon broke out for fleas and butter at sundown took in sail and were round to the northward and westward headed north west then the night with a light breeze and fine weather so ends this day.

Remarks on board Saturday January the 22nd 1859

This day commenset with a light breeze from north east and fine weather latitude 54.46 longitude 20.41 headed on openet tracks then the day crasping at sundown took in sail headed to the westward headed to the westward then the night with a light breeze and fine weather so ends this day.

Remarks on board Sunday January the 23rd 1859

This day commenset with a light breeze from the northward and thick weather blacked ships to the eastward at eleven o'clock commenset to rain with thunder and lightning at two o'clock headed ship to the westward at sundown took in sail still continues to rain and a light breeze had it rany then the night so ends this day.

Remarks on board Monday January the 24th 1859

This day commenset with a strong breeze from the northward with thick smoky weather and a heavy swell running saw a ship steering

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South latitude 6.00 no long haul saw two shoals of blackfish this afternoon but did not hear them and then the day saw several birds a priest at sundown took in sail and left to the wind headed north west by west at twelve o'clock were round to the eastward still continues a strong breeze so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 25th 1859

This day commenset with a strong breeze from north east and pleasant weather were round and made sail, stood north west by west then the day hauled 6.24 longitude 23.9 nothing going on north remark at sundown took in sail and left to the wind to the northward headed north by west then the night so ends this day.

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 26th 1859

This day commenset with a strong breeze from north east and thick smoky weather made sail and left off west north west latitude 6.53 longitude 24.2 at two o'clock spoke the Brig Leonards of west port and gained with her at sundown took in sail left to the wind headed north north west then the night so ends this day.

Remarks on board Thursday January the 27th 1859

This day commenset with a fine breeze and pleasant weather made sail and left off west north west at ten o'clock spoke the Barque Matlapersett of Puffat and gained with her then the day at sundown took in sail and left to the wind headed south north west the Matlapersett is bound direct for the west Indies for
