Remarks on board Monday February the 28th 1858

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the eastward stood in towards the land at eleven o'clock spoke the *Barman* to the north of Popocatepetl and gamared with her this afternoon light breeze saw several sails steering to the southward at five o'clock Captain I came on board took in sail had it done the fore part of the night latter part light breeze and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 1st 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the east and saw blackfish but did not have saw several sails steering to the northward and a Steam Ship steering to the eastward this afternoon saw humpbacks and took one boat but could not get fast at sundown took in sail and kept to the wind to the southward light breeze thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 2nd 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and fine weather at eight o'clock left off to the westward saw humpbacks and several sails steering to the northward saw Moore's island to the southward of us at four o'clock commenced to rain at sundown in sail and kept to the wind to the southward at nine o'clock cleared up and died away calm and remains so thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Thursday March the 3rd 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and fine weather set all sail made to the northward and eastward men employed working on rigging saw humpbacks

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At sundown took in sail saw three sails due steering to the northward the other one a shadow or crusing latitud 68° longit 120° had fine weather thru the night and a light breeze made to the southward so ends

Remarks on board Friday March the 4th 1858

This day commenced with a fine breeze from the eastward and pleasant weather took one ship to the northward made sail saw humpbacks at eleven were round and steered south west at one o'clock took two boats for humpbacks and blackfish but could not get fast at two came on board at sunset took in sail and kept to the wind made south half west Moore's island bore north west five miles distant had fine weather thru the night and a light breeze so ends

Remarks on board Saturday March the 5th 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and pleasant weather turned up the sail boat and fairer it latitud 18° 00' longit 125° 00' this afternoon broke out for floor stanch and by north thru the day saw humpbacks at sundown took in sail and kept to the wind to the southward at three o'clock were round to the northward so ends this day

Remarks on board Sunday March the 6th 1858

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward made sail and left off west for the island of Teana at ten o'clock had a boat and pole on shore to get some anchorage at one came on board again caught a blackfish saw several sails at six o'clock took in sail spoke west thru the day latitud 16° 00' longit 126° 00'
