From the harbor Sunday Sabbath started a few minutes and out in harbor again he has been crasing her fire with and seen nothing left off well by night at sundown look in sail at twelve o'clock left with the wind to the southward had a strong breeze thru the night so ends this day

Remarks on board Monday March the 14th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze from the eastward left off west by south saw blackbird going quick to the windward saw a Steamer steering to the eastward nothing going on with remark at sundown look in sail had a light breeze thru the night ahead to the westward all these twenty four hours - latitude 19.50 Longitude 73.42

Remarks on board Tuesday March the 15th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the southward and eastward and good weather made sail saw several Schooners had a light breeze thru the day at sundown look in sail off the west end St Domingo had a light breeze the fore part of the night after put strong breeze headed to the northward thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Wednesday March the 16th 1859

This day commenced with a fine breeze from north east and fine weather made sail broke out for water and flour at twelve o'clock began to blow strong at two o'clock in the mainmast and jib at four o'clock saw Cuba cañon at sundown look in the fore topsail and found it had a strong breeze thru the night so ends this day

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Remarks on board Thursday March the 17th 1859

This day commenced with a strong breeze and foggy weather lost the fore topsail and jib saw a Brig heading to the southward at twelve o'clock left off west saw the land latitude 19.50 Longitude 76.03 had a strong breeze thru the day at sundown look in the fore topsail and found it to be one to the southward strong breeze the fore part of the night after put light breeze and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Friday March the 18th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze and fine weather made sail and left off west by south the fore topsail and jib at one o'clock saw several sails to the southward longitude 76.03 had a light breeze thru the day from the southward at six o'clock look in sail found breeze at the yards headed west by the wind had it turn thru the night so ends

Remarks on board Saturday March the 19th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the westward and pleasant weather set all sail heading north west until three o'clock then backed ship to the southward saw a ship heading to the southward at six o'clock look in sail had a light breeze thru the night and fine weather so ends

Remarks on board Sunday March the 20th 1859

This day commenced with a light breeze from the eastward and pleasant weather made sail and left off to the westward no bottom and longitude at one o'clock raised black fish
